The Board of Supervisors of Augusta County, in regular meeting on the 25th day of October, 2017 adopted the following:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the street described on the attached Additions Form AM-4.3, fully incorporated herein by reference, are shown on plats recorded in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Augusta County, and

WHEREAS, the Area Land Use Engineer for the Virginia Department of Transportation has advised this Board the streets meet the requirements established by the Subdivision Street Requirements of the Virginia Department of Transportation, and

WHEREAS, the County and the developer have entered into an agreement for comprehensive storm water detention as per the code of Ordinances, [*Stormwater Legal Agreement recorded in instrument number 100006094*], recorded [August 9, 2010] which applies to this request for addition.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the county agrees that VDOT has no maintenance, upkeep and/or repair responsibility or liability for such storm water detention facilities except in case of physical damage resulting from road construction projects administered by VDOT. This agreement does not relieve the parties thereto of their rights and obligations pursuant to Storm water Management Regulations VR215-02-00 et seq. and related state regulations as amended or modified from time to time. Further, the County agrees not to hold VDOT liable for damages resulting from the County's failure to enforce County ordinances and regulations relating to storm water flow.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County will not seek indemnification or contribution from VDOT to correct damages arising from improper maintenance or construction of storm water detention facilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, this Board requests the Virginia Department of Transportation to add the street(s) described on the attached Additions Form AM-4.3 to the secondary system of state highways, pursuant to §33.2-705, Code of Virginia, and the Department's Subdivision Street Requirements, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, this Board guarantees a clear and unrestricted right-of-way, as described, with necessary easements for cuts, fills and drainage as recorded in Plat Book 1, Pages 9519-9520, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Virginia Department of Transportation will only maintain those facilities located within the dedicated right-of-way. All other facilities outside of the right-of-way will be the responsibility of others.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Area Land Use Engineer for the Virginia Department of Transportation.

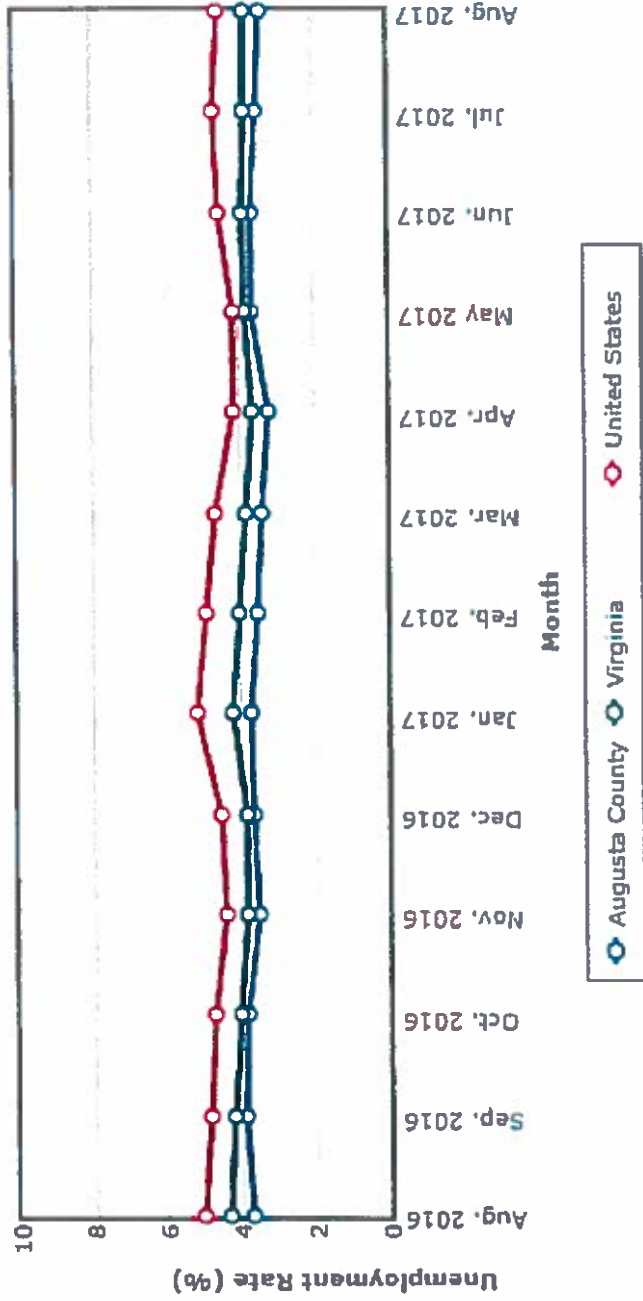

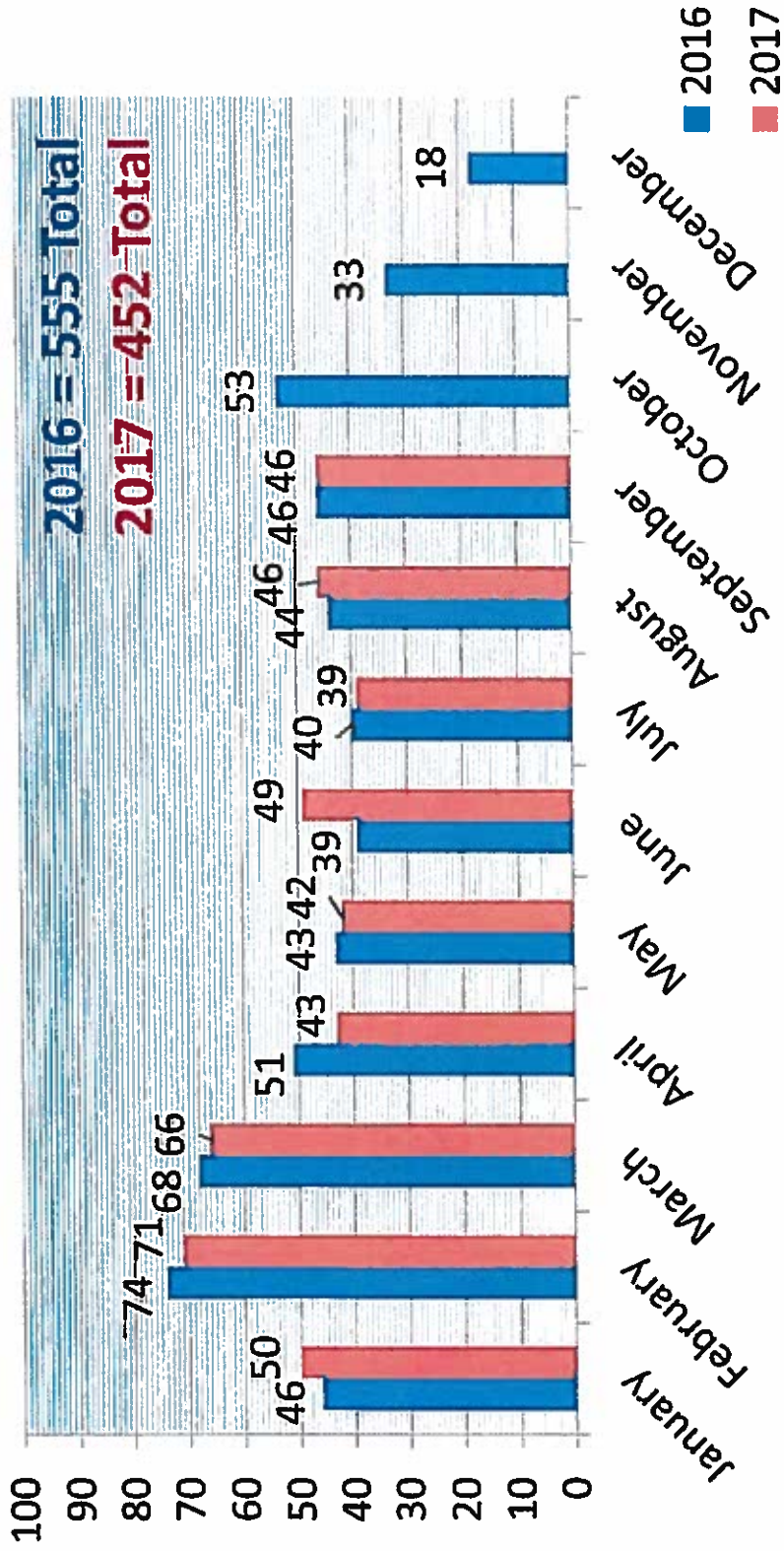

In September, fire and rescue agencies that serve the County of Augusta received a combined total of 1,507 calls, of which 57 were calls turned over to next due agencies. Of those calls turned over 18 were due to being on a previous call. Fire agencies received 559 fire and EMS calls, of which 12 were turned over to next due agencies. Rescue agencies received 948 EMS calls, of which 45 were turned over to next due agencies.

Chief Carson Holloway was on vacation the first week in September. Upon his return he attended Leadership Symposium, 1033 Class, several staff meetings, a meeting with Deerfield volunteers, and Mt. Solon's open house. He conducted full and part-time interviews, met with the School Audit Committee, attended the Boards & Commissions Recognition dinner, and met on 4 for Life funds. Chief Holloway attended Staff Briefing, the Officers' Association meeting, and made a fulltime employment offer. In addition, he continued working with Division Commanders on updating the staffing moves to go into effect in November.

The Finance Department reported to Fire-Rescue that Revenue Recovery funds collected in September were \$101,117.46 for previous months' transports. The number of transport incidents in September: Deerfield-3, Churchville-30, Stuarts Draft-92, Preston L. Yancey-96, Craigsville-Augusta Springs-27, New Hope Vol-1, New Hope Career-25, Mount Solon-31, Riverheads-49, and Weyers Cave-39, total for the month-393.

Volunteer Coordinator/Lieutenant Minday Craun worked on several projects in September. She prepared for a public awareness event on October 8th, "Touch A Fire-Rescue Truck" at Lowes of Staunton. Lieutenant Craun and Chrissy Snyder worked on a school schedule for visits by fire and rescue to hopefully increase the recruitment efforts of the volunteer agencies. She visited several agencies and attended several other meetings during the month. Statistics for September 2017 include; 25 recruitment contacts, 30 volunteer visits, and 10 station visits.

The Training Division staff continued to focus on upcoming training events. All staff dedicated time to planning and conducting training for the volunteer burn, the start of the EMT program, Pump Operations, annual physical assessments for ACFR staff, monthly Volunteer Officer Training, and the ACFR Company Drill. There were several hours devoted to meeting and developing the ACFR Truck Operations program, as well as preparing for and successfully completing the testing mechanisms for the Education Coordinator Program with the Virginia Office of EMS. In addition, staff also attended several meetings with local and regional partners, attended the quarterly TRT Drill in Rockingham County, attended a Regional School in Lynchburg, and assisted on two emergency incidents in the County.

Mission: "To serve and protect our citizens and visitors through education and the delivery of all fire and emergency medical services."

Division Commander Greg Schacht attended numerous staff meetings, met with the Chief on staffing moves, and met with the Arial Class development committee. He attended Mt. Solon's open house and Deerfield and Augusta County volunteer membership meetings. DC Schacht assisted with three days of firefighter physical agility assessments, participated in weather and Intranet conference calls, conducted full and part-time firefighter interviews, worked on personnel evaluations, and covered a station as part of staffing. He assisted with moving apparatus around, obtaining station supplies, and with the Tier II HPO Leadership retreat. His training for the month included; a leadership symposium, a two day 1033 CE class, and i-gel training. In addition, DC Schacht taught leadership officer hours for the volunteers, assisted with development of our firefighter skills day, and conducted two football game standbys. He reviewed personnel timesheets, 3 site plans, conducted 30 station visits, and responded to 3 DO calls.

Division Commander Jeff Hurst responded to 2 DO calls, made 27 station visits with multiple volunteer and public contacts, attended Chiefs' Luncheon, and Leadership Symposium. He participated in reviewing applications for full and part-time personnel. DC Hurst continued to conduct drug and alcohol testing in accordance with ACFR policy, follow up on vehicle maintenance and small equipment repairs. In addition, he attended the County Leadership retreat, continued to participate in the turnout gear committee, and attended several staff meetings. He has been working with the Chief and other staffing moves, attended volunteer meetings at New Hope, Stuarts Draft Rescue, and other agencies as requested. DC Hurst coordinated hose testing and ladder testing countywide for all agencies. Other areas of responsibility include East Division, Communications Equipment, Quartermaster, and vehicle/equipment maintenance and repair.

EMS Captain Matt Lawler participated in various staff meetings, met with the OMDs, conducted 25 station visits, delivered EMS supplies, and coordinated maintenance of EMS equipment/ apparatus. He assisted in RSAF grant preparation, conducted training sessions for career and volunteers, and an i-gel in-service for AH Emergency Department personnel. He coordinated EMS release processes for new employees and ALS providers and worked with the OMDs to develop/implement department specific protocols related to the i-gel supraglottic airway device. EMS Captain Lawler prepared/delivered protocol field inserts and deployed i-gel devices to all ACFR licensed apparatus. He worked with multiple institutions in preparation for fall internships with the department, participated in two full and part-time hiring processes, taught two ACFR EMT Classes, and continued development of a STAT drug box program. In addition, he provided patient-specific quality assurance follow-up, attended meetings with the AH Chest Pain Accreditation Committee, the CSEMS Council Executive Committee, and a Va Office of EMS Education Coordinator Update. He coordinated one ALS skills drill, prepared a report on First Responders for the Board, worked with the Training Division to process CE credits, reviewed accreditation standards, and assisted in the implementation of a Learning Management System.

EMS Supervisors responded to 66 incidents, 18 of which required ALS intervention. Department preceptors mentored EMS students and personnel on 9 shifts totaling 114 hours.

A-Shift Captain Bryan Mace attended two meetings with the Chief, Division Commanders, and Captains, several shift training sessions, and regular weekly staff meetings with Admin. He delivered uniforms, supplies, apparatus, and equipment, worked on reviewing timesheets, and assisted with moving apparatus, personnel, and equipment to ensure service delivery. Captain Mace worked on scheduling issues and assisted the other Captains with completing the October schedule. He worked on training on Active 911 system for preplans, responded while providing shift coverage to several calls, and worked on several other projects. He made regular station visits, continued to work with Augusta Workplace Wellness on


department fit testing, and answered five DO calls. Captain Mace evaluated on shift training sessions, attended a preplan, completed three employee evaluations, and reviewed several others.

B-Shift Captain Bernie Hewitt attended staff meetings, responded to one DO call, handled apparatus maintenance issues as they arose on shift, and assisted with moving apparatus as needed. He rode as staffing to cover personnel and covered as DO during the day for Admin while in meetings and classes.

The crew worked to help implement the maintenance policy currently under review by the Division Commanders and Chief, as well as priced and submitted a request for additional station tools. Had several positive interactions with the public regarding the department and duties. Captain Hewitt completed the physical assessment along with personnel from his crew, provided coverage on two shifts for vacations, and attended annual evaluation training in preparation of employee evaluations. He also attended the ALS skills drill and completed the stations for the fall session.

C-Shift Captain Josh Bailey worked as part of staffing at Station 11 most of the month. He responded to four DO calls, worked on evaluations, scheduling, and timesheets. He completed physical agility testing, and attended Nozzle Forward training.

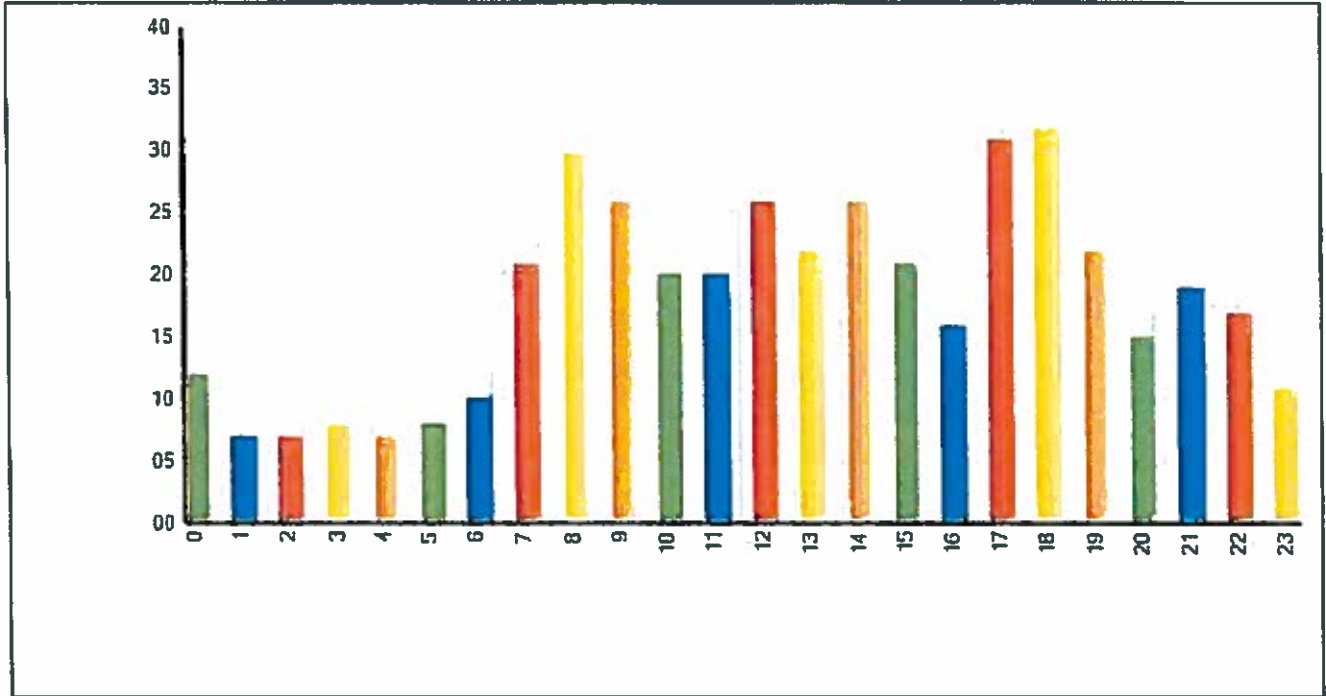

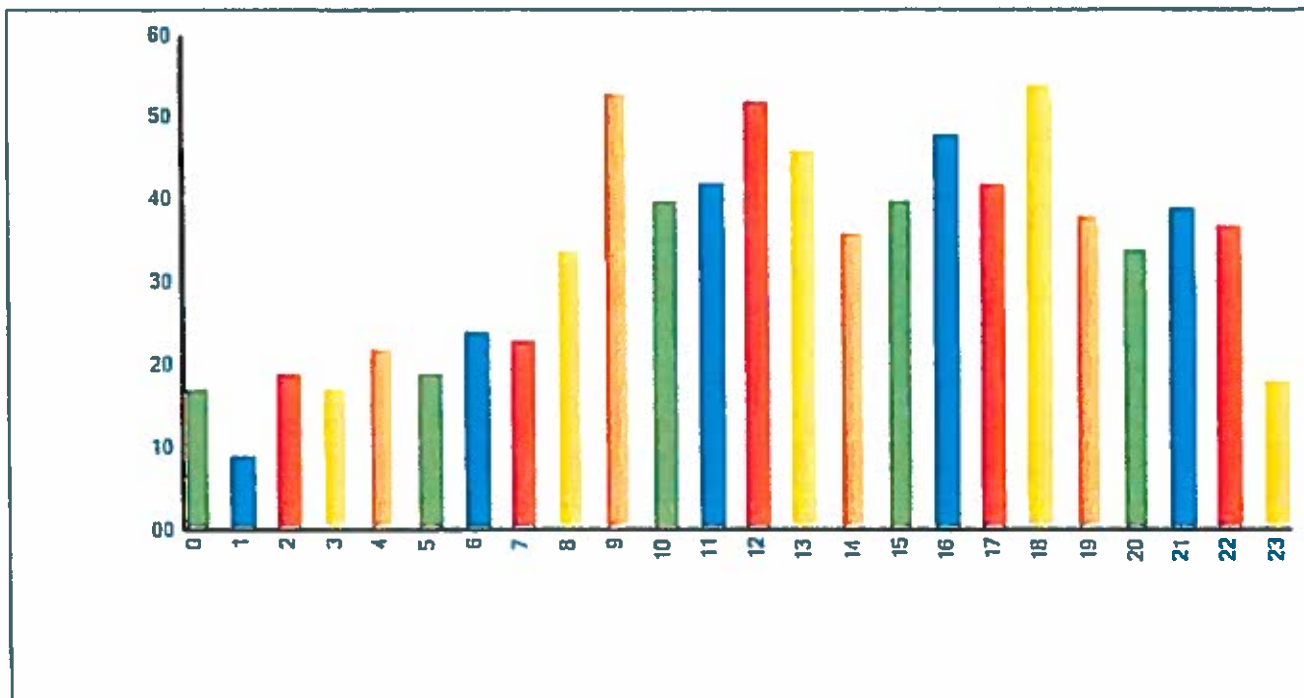

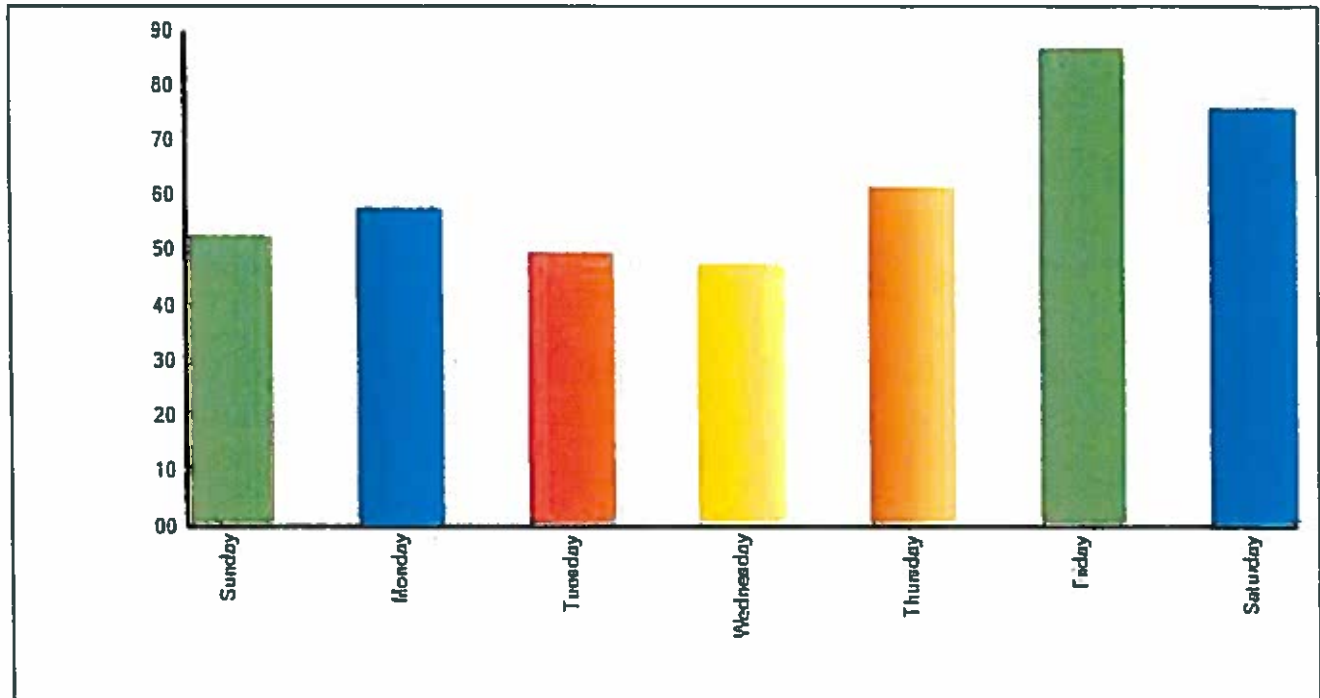

Calls For Service by Day of Week

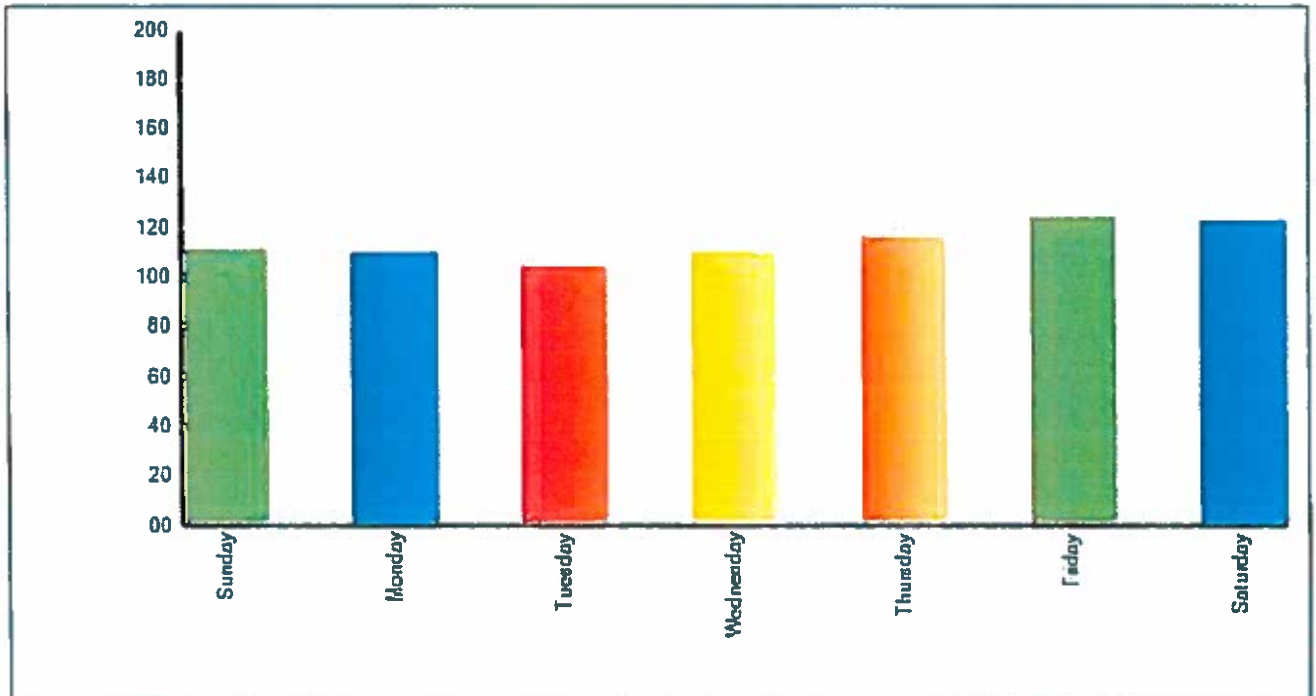

At their last meeting on October 3, 2017, the Agriculture Industry Board elected to provide \$5,000 from their budget, to the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (VDACS), to aid in an economic feasibility study of dairy processing in Virginia.

This study will be a collaborative effort among VDACS, the Virginia Dairymen's Association, and multiple counties across Virginia. The study is an attempt to develop in-state value-added dairy production, and to recruit additional dairy processing businesses to Virginia.

We have received quotes to complete painting of the cupolas at the Augusta County Circuit Courthouse. Scope of work includes the following:

1. Access to the cupolas.
2. Surface preparation.
3. One coat of primer.
4. Two coats of paint to match as closely as possible the existing color.
5. Repair of loose ornate surfaces.
6. Seal any areas found to prevent water leaks/damages.
7. Cleaning of paint chips from surface preparation.
8. Remove guttering around lower cupola, repair area as needed, prime and paint according to specification.
9. Prepare, prime and paint lower cupola roof according to specification.
10. Include as an alternate the method and cost to clean Lady Justice statue.

Contractor will be required to hold proper State licensing requirements and submit to the County a Certificate of Insurance.

There is a large deviation on quotes. Staff has reviewed the quotes and have contacted companies for clarifications where needed to be sure all requirements were met. We believe the difference primarily is how the company plans to provide access to the work areas. Scaffolding and access to the cupolas is a large portion of the cost for this project.

Low bid, including cleaning of Lady Justice is \$65,060. Staff suggests adding 15% contingency to this project incase unforeseen repairs are needed to the cupolas. We should also not that the bid includes one month of lift and scaffolding rental costs. If the project exceeds one month, due to weather conditions, the cost will increase per the additional rental fees.

Funding is currently available in the capital account for painting.

We recommend that this work be considered by the Board of Supervisors in the amount of \$74,819 from account 70-80000-8198.

Information will be given out at the Staff Briefing.
