VDOT Report
September 24, 2018

Mr. Kelley (Beverly Manor)

- RTE 637 (Jericho Rd) –Curve Warning signs have been installed at the sharp curve at Lakeshore Lane.
- RTE 637 (Jericho Rd) – speed study being conducted on section from Route 250 to the end of the hard surface roadway.
- I-81 Exits 220, 221 and 222 ramp extensions – construction has been completed on the southbound deceleration lane extension at Route 250. Work will continue on this project this summer and fall.
- RTE 262 and RTE 613 (Spring Hill Rd) – moving forward with scheduling a Citizen Information Meeting to present a Reduced Conflict U- Turn (RCUT) intersection improvement plan.
- RTE 612 (Laurel Hill Rd.) - Repairs have been made on turn radiuses for cross-overs with more permanent repairs scheduled to be completed by the end of fall.
- RTE 11 (Lee Hwy) - facing on several curb line drop inlets have been repaired
- Coordinating with CSPDC and Brite Transit in preparation of Smart Scale application for installation of a pedestrian crosswalk and signal indications at the intersection of Route 250 and Route 792 (Sangers Lane).
- Repair of non-hard surface roads due to flood damage will continue.
- Mill Place Parkway – Smart Scale project scoping meeting being scheduled for early October.

Dr. Pattie (North River)

- RTE 613 (Spring Hill Rd.) past RTE 699 (Ridge Rd) - shoulder repairs and brush trimming has begun and will continue until complete by the end of summer.
- RTE 742 (Mt Pisgah Rd) – Curve improvements at the intersection of RTE 742 and RTE 744 under review. Met with property owner to discuss options.
- RTE 756 (Fairburn Rd) - Sharp curve scheduled to be addressed, drainage upgrades are scheduled.
- Helen Lane – Field review with property owners on 8/13 to discuss possible Rural Addition. Estimate for Rural Addition work was approximately \$80,000.
- RTE 42 – Latex overlay scheduled from RTE 738 (Roudabush Rd) to Parnassus scheduled for the month of September are currently postponed due to Hurricane Florence.
- RTE 744 (Leaport Rd.) - Rural Rustic project progressing as scheduled. Expected completion this Fall.
- RTE 813 (Maury Mill Rd) – Planning to replace existing deficient box culvert, meeting with utility companies and ACSA to determine plans for relocations.
- RTE 753 (Nash Rd) - Driveway and crossline pipes have been installed. Excavation operations have begun and will continue until complete.

- RTE 910 (Wampler Rd) - Installation of various pipe culverts has begun. Construction of a turnaround at the end of state maintenance is scheduled for the later part of summer.
- RTE 738 (Roudabush Rd) – Turn around construction project scheduled for completion by the end of Fall.
- RTE 743 (Berry Ln) - Millings placement and End-of -State Maintenance turnaround project is scheduled to be completed by the end of Fall, weather permitting.
- Speed study is being conducted on RTE 809 (Iron Works Rd) and RTE 747 (Mossy Creek Rd) between Route 42 and Route 613 at Mossy Creek Church - citizen request.
- Repair of non-hard surface roads due to flood damage will continue.

Mrs. Bragg (South River)

- Update on Route 610 Project (Howardsville Turnpike) –Detour to Patton Farm Rd has been implemented to begin construction on east end of project. (Through traffic was temporarily routed through construction area due to flooding conditions on detour route).
- RTE 634 (China Clay Rd) – speed zone review will be conducted between Rt 610 (Howardsville Turnpike) and Rt 633 (Patton Farm Rd) to assess whether existing 45 mph speed limit should be adjusted.
- .RTE 1509 (High St) - Concrete gutter pans and curb repairs are scheduled.
- RTE 814 (Love Mtn Rd) – shoulder repairs and pipe flushing have been completed; but will reassess after flooding.
- RTE 664 (Reeds Gap Rd) – Shoulder repairs and ditch clean out has been completed; but will reassess after flooding.
- RTE 340 – Latex overlay from RTE 657 to Sheetz has been completed. Permanent pavement markings have been completed.
- RTE 610 (Howardsville T'pike) - ditch clean out and pipe flushing has begun and has been completed.
- RTE 912 (Hodge St.) Shoulder repairs have been completed
- Wayne Ave. coordination with County and Aug County Service Authority continuing.

Mr. Garber (Middle River)

- RTE 616 (Dam Town Road) –Preconstruction meeting is complete .Notice to proceed mid-October.
- RTE 825 (South River Rd), Harriston area – speed study being conducted from Route 778 (Patterson Mill Rd) northward through the residential area (approximately 0.8 mile) – citizen request. Study recommends 35 mph speed limit.
- RTE 616 (Rock Mountain Lane) – speed zoning study has been completed between Route 340 and Route 870 (Point Lookout Road). 35 mph signs have been installed.

- RTE 663 (Mine Branch Road) – speed zoning study completed between Route 340 and Route 612 (Crimora Mine Road) to determine if the existing 45 mph speed limit should be adjusted - citizen request. The existing 45 mph speed limit on Crimora Mine Road in this area was also reviewed in conjunction with this study. Recommendation is to change the 45 mph zones to 35 mph. The 45 mph signs have been replaced with 35 mph signs on these two roads.
- RTE 340 – Low and washout shoulder repairs have been completed.
- Repair of non-hard surface roads due to flooding will continue.
- Pipe flushing operations at various locations have been completed.
- RTE 774 (Broad Run Rd) – Replacement of 72” CMP with 9’x7’ concrete box culvert has been scheduled and will be completed in October.
- RTE 771 (Gentry Rd) - Brush trimming along both sides of the road have started and will be completed by the end of September
- RTE 907 (Rifes Ford Rd) - Boom axe operations have begun and will be completed by the end of September.

Mrs. Carter (Pastures)

- RTE 250 (Hankey Mountain Hwy) - various cross pipe replacements from RTE 715 to Curry Turkey houses scheduled to be completed by the end of September.
- RTE 42 –Latex overlay from Shenandale Gun Club to RTE 725 (Jerusalem Chapel rd.) scheduled for the month of September has been postponed due to Hurricane Florence.
- RTE 250 – Latex overlay from RTE 736 (Jennings Gap Rd) to Staunton City Limits scheduled for the month of September has been postponed due to Hurricane Florence.
- RTE 254 (Parkersburg Turnpike) – “Watch For Turning Vehicles – Next ½ Mile” signs have been installed in the area of the passing zone and turning safety concerns between Gap Orchard Lane and Ole Country Lane.
- RTE 250 (Hankey Mountain Hwy) - Shoulder widening operation scheduled for the Fall. New guard rail install is under review.
- RTE 250 (Churchville Ave) - crossline pipe failure has been repaired.
- RTE 250 (Hanky Mountain HWY) - large double run of 54”x38” CMP replacement has been scheduled for completion by the end of September.
- Repair non-hard surface roads due to flooding will continue.

Mr. Coleman (Wayne)

- RTE 794 (Sanger’s Lane) – Under review for possible spot safety improvements.
- RTE 642 (Barren Ridge Rd) – Preliminary Engineering for Rural Rustic to begin this fall, construction planned for 2019.
- RTE 358 (WWRC Small Area Study) - County has submitted Smart Scale application for short and long-term improvement funding. VDOT also seeking additional possible funding sources for short-term improvements.

- RTE 640 (Goose Creek Road) - Drainage concerns at address 2015 are being reviewed. Erosion at the inlet end of driveway pipe has been reviewed. Trying to make contact with property owner to discuss.
- RTE 608 (Long Meadow Rd.) – Right turn lane onto RTE 250 West – Revenue sharing project under development, County currently obtaining R/W.
- Pipe flushing operations scheduled at various locations have been completed.
- Rt 1368 (North Campus Drive) at Lifecore Drive intersection (across from Village Creek Drive) – painted stop bar will be installed at intersection.
- Repair for non-hard surface roads due to flooding will continue.

Mr. Shull (Riverheads)

- RTE 681 (Mt Herman Rd) –Box culvert installations have been completed. Rural Rustic project underway with clearing, grubbing, excavation and pipe installations.
- RTE 252 (Middlebrook Rd) - additional rock outcropping removal at the Intersection of RTE 620 will be scheduled by the end of summer.
- Intersection of RTE 11 and RTE 666 (Lofton Rd) – exploring possible improvements to intersection approach and turning radius and also extension of southbound left turn lane from Route 11 onto Lofton Road. (Extension of left turn lane will require changes in the existing passing zone configuration).
- RTE 620 (Newport Rd) - Guardrail extension at bridge before RTE 252 is under review.
- RTE 655 (Walnut Hills Rd.) – Double line of 72" pipe under Walnut Hills Rd. (near Walnut Hills Campground) to receive interior lining treatment this summer to extend service life.
- RTE 11 – Latex overlay from RTE 701 to Staunton City limits scheduled for the month of September has been postponed due to Hurricane Florence.
- RTE 662 (Old Greenville School Rd.) - Sidewalk repairs have been completed
- Repair for non-hard surface roads due to flooding will continue.

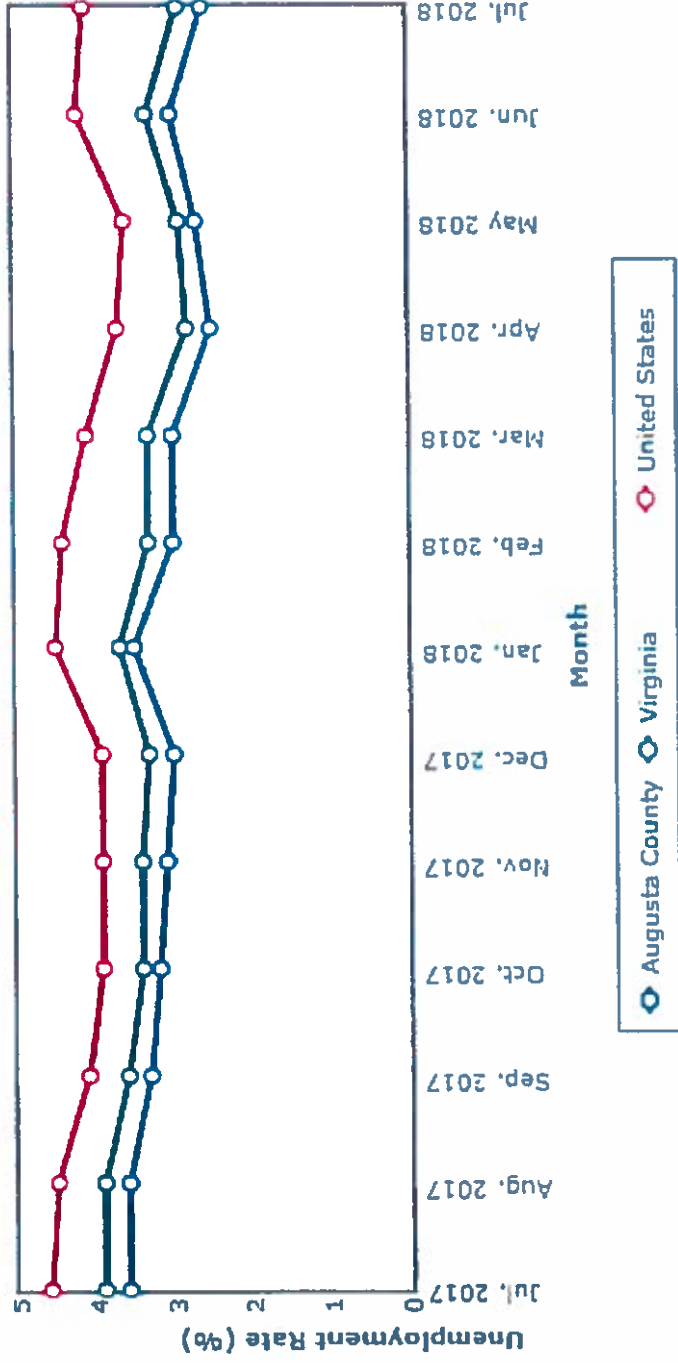

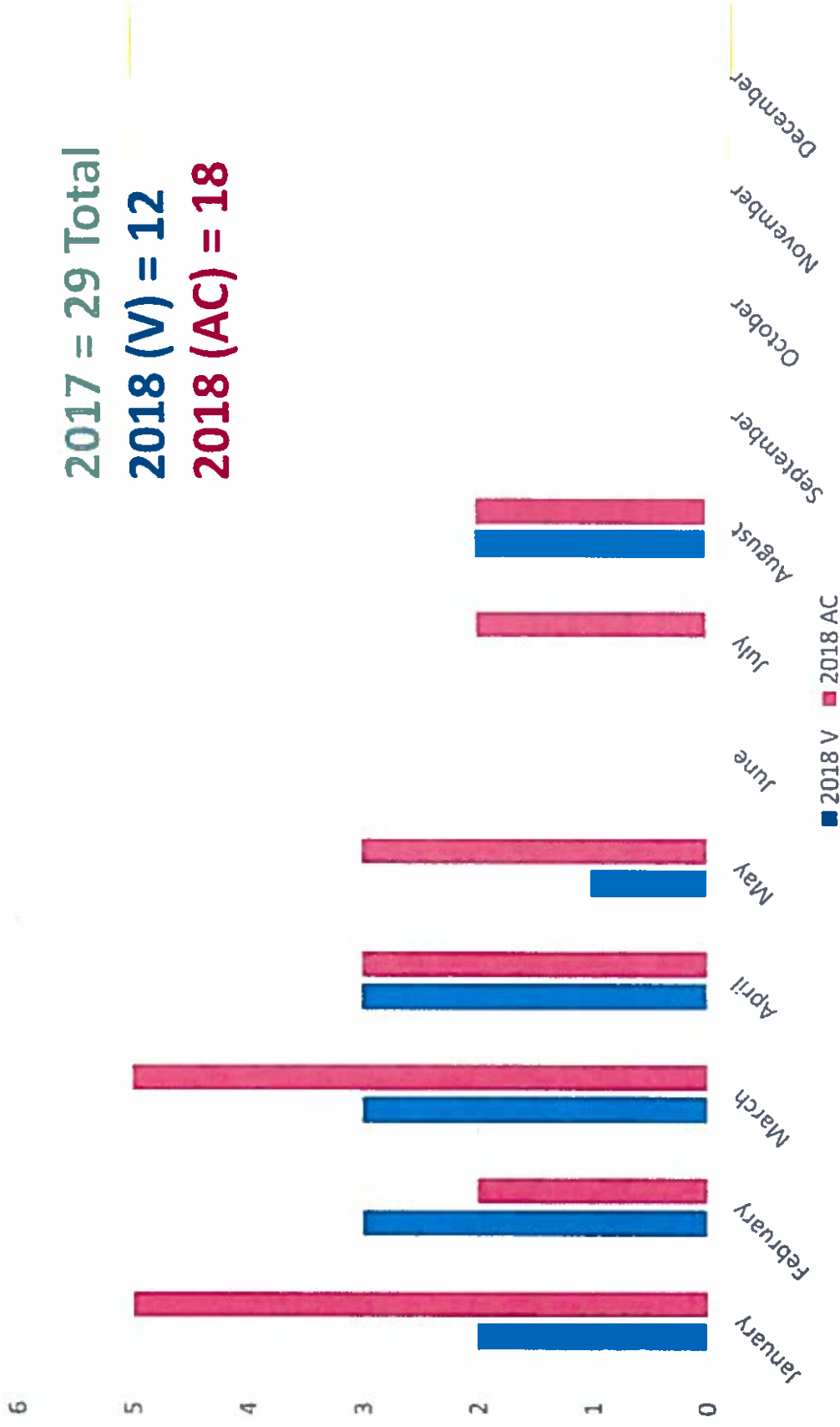

AUGUSTA COUNTY FIRE-RESCUE REPORT

August 2018

In July, fire and rescue agencies that serve the County of Augusta received a combined total of 1,590 calls, of which 72 were calls turned over to next due agencies. Of those calls turned over 36 were due to being on a previous call. Fire agencies received 610 fire and EMS calls, of which 12 were turned over to next due agencies. Rescue agencies received 980 EMS calls, of which 60 were turned over to next due agencies.

Revenue Recovery funds collected in August for previous months was not available from the Finance Department in time for this report. The number of transport incidents in August: Deerfield-2, Churchville-20, Stuarts Draft-79, Preston L. Yancey-113, Craigs ville-Augusta Springs-35, New Hope Vol-5, New Hope Career-29, Mount Solon-15, Riverheads-46, and Weyers Cave-38, total for the month-380.

Lieutenant Minday Craun attended and/or assisted with several public education events, the Augusta County Fair, National Night Out, and attended several meetings. She participated with the Shenandoah Valley Regional Airport Full Scale Exercise planning, Dinner with the Chiefs, and continued working to complete the Smoke Alarm Grant. Statistics for August 2018 include; 10 recruitment contacts, 28 volunteer visits, and 12 station visits.

Training Division staff remained focused on preparing for fall classes and delivering the current EMT class. Staff spent several hours preparing for 12 new employees, looked at two possible acquired structures for training, handled vehicle maintenance arrangements for several vehicles, and conducting annual written pump testing. They also assisted with the Augusta County Fair, attended several meetings, and spent several hours on administrative work for the above events. Captain Shaver also assisted on several emergency calls during the month.

Division Commander Greg Schacht attended numerous staff meetings, met with BRCC on their active shooter drill, met with contractors on projects at stations 11 and 10, and met with multiple high schools on standby MOUs. He met with Highland County regarding their EMS program, with ECC and Mr. Fitzgerald on Craigs ville VFD EMS dispatches, and with Candy Hensley on upcoming infrastructure projects. DC Schacht worked with new hires on orientation, taught them building construction, welcomed the new EMT class, and met with Chief Mastin. He attended Middlebrook and Riverheads volunteer meetings, stood by at the County Fair, attended the Chiefs' luncheon, the dinner with the Chiefs, and a site plan meeting. DC Schacht met with the Emergency Services Committee, attended

Staff Briefing and the Virginia Fire Officers Academy graduation. He reviewed the Shenandoah Juvenile Center Emergency Plan, assisted Pegasus with a disaster drill, covered an open shift, obtained station supplies, reviewed and revised several General Orders, and worked with HR on personnel issues. In addition, he reviewed timesheets and developed the September schedule. He reviewed 5 site plans, 2 rezoning requests, and conducted 29 station visits. DC Schacht responded to 5 Duty Officer Calls; 1 structure fire, 2 water rescues, 1 MVC, 1 EMS call, and received numerous Duty Officer Notifications.

Division Commander Jeff Hurst continued to oversee Vehicles, Communications, Quartermaster, Haz-Mat, TRT, and equipment repairs, maintenance, and program development. Station Check training was initiated with admin users and he continued to administrator the drug and alcohol testing program. Caterpillar Settlement payment was received for the class action settlement. He assisted the public as requested, attended several volunteer meetings as requested, reviewed timesheets and monthly scheduling of staff, and continued to act as liaison for the SCBA project for County volunteers; Verona received 5 SCBAs, Doods' SCBA are in, and Middlebrook has placed an order. DC Hurst attended the volunteer Chiefs' dinner, the Department head meeting where he presented a short segment on "Respect Based Management", which included his horse, Garth. He stood by at the Augusta County Fair, put together the billing date for the VDEM Haz-Mat standby in Charlottesville, and continued follow up and scheduling for apparatus pump testing, hose and ladder testing countywide, as well as other projects being maintained and conducted. DC Hurst conducted 44 station visits with multiple volunteer and public contacts. He responded to 3 Duty Officer Calls.

EMS Captain Matt Lawler participated in various staff meetings, ordered/delivered EMS supplies to stations and provided for the preventative maintenance and repair of EMS equipment. He continued to work with Finance, the QA Committee and operations to optimize revenue recovery processes, reviewed EMS Supervisor incidents as part of the quality assurance process and provided patient-specific quality assurance follow-up to providers and medical directors. Capt. Lawler conducted EMS orientation for new hires and oversaw multiple EMS release processes. He provided oversight of the department's infectious disease control program, served as the on-duty Infection Control Officer for multiple shifts, reviewed timesheets, and conducted multiple station visits. He processed CE credits for training and assisted in the management of EMS-specific education on Target Solutions. Capt. Lawler assisted two localities as an MCI drill evaluator, attended meetings with regional and state EMS partners, and participated in public relation events. He worked with the EMS Supervisors and OMDs on projects including protocol development and evaluation of patient care equipment. EMS Supervisors responded to 76 incidents, 24 which required ALS intervention. Department preceptors mentored EMS students and personnel on 31 shifts totaling 372 hours.

A-Shift Captain Bryan Mace attended numerous meetings and several shift training sessions. He reviewed timesheets, several employee evaluations, assisted with moving fire apparatus, ambulances, and equipment to different locations to ensure service delivery, and worked throughout the month on multiple scheduling issues. Capt. Mace assisted the other Captains with maintaining the schedule once posted and worked on Active 911 preplan training. He worked on several other projects as assigned by Admin, continued to work with Augusta Health Workplace Wellness on SCBA fit testing, and reviewed timesheets for A shift. He answered 3 Duty Officer Calls for the month; 1 Assist w/Squad 10, 1 MVC w/entrapment, and 1 odor in a commercial structure. He conducted 17 station visits, worked on completing 2 employee evaluations, and continued with an online course. In addition, he attended the Augusta County Fair, training at Red Roof Inn, and dinner with the Chiefs.

B-Shift Captain Bernie Hewitt attended meetings on and off duty, visited several stations, moved equipment for service as staffing would allow or coordinated moves with other personnel. Several maintenance issues arose throughout the month that required apparatus being moved to cover other units. Capt. Hewitt began the evaluations for shift personnel for the year, approved B shift timesheets, and trained with the shift as available. He completed an online Battalion Chief Officer Development Program and attended the Pegasus emergency drill. Duty officer responses; 3 structure fires, 2 small fires, 1 fire due to possible lightning strike, 1 MVC with vehicle into a structure/ possible entrapment, 1 entrapment emergency, 1 possible aircraft emergency, and 1 vehicle into a structure.

C-Shift Captain Josh Bailey worked as part of staffing at Station 11 for several shifts, ran a structure fire and assisted the ACSO with a SWAT standby. He worked towards completion of a 6-week officer development class, provided guidance on timesheets and schedule to the two newly promoted Lieutenants assigned to C Shift and reviewed all C Shift timesheets. Capt. Bailey filled multiple vacancies and sick call outs and approved/denied several shift trades.

SUMMARY OF REQUEST: A request to rezone approximately 8.50 acres from General Agriculture to General Business owned by Kenneth Ray Bradley, Jr., Inc. and located on the east side of East Side Highway (Route 340), approximately .17 of a mile south of Dooms Crossing Road (Route 611) in the Wayne District. The proposed general usage of the property is business. The general usage stated in the Comprehensive Plan is Community Mixed Use with a proposed density of six to twelve dwelling units per acre and, on up to 40% of the total land area, retail and office uses and in some, but not all cases, industrial uses.

PROPOSED PROFFER: Development of Tax Map Parcel #68-52L shall not include the following uses: fast food restaurants, gasoline retail outlets, and car washes.

VICINITY ZONING: General Agriculture to the north, south, east and west. Public Use Overlay zoning for Eastside Speedway to the east.

PREVIOUS ZONING: General Agriculture

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN PLANNING POLICY AREA/FUTURE LAND USE DESIGNATION: Urban Service Area/Community Mixed Use.

SOILS: Not applicable.

COMMENTS FROM ENGINEER: A level of drainage analysis was performed for construction of the building and parking areas that currently exist on the site. Additional development will require analysis of any new improvements.

The applicant is advised to contact the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality for any requirements related to proposed work in wetland areas or adjacent to any streams.

This property drains to South River which is listed on the Virginia DEQ Draft 2014 Impaired Waters List. This impaired segment extends from the INVISTA discharge downstream to its confluence with Porterfield Run. The impaired uses are aquatic life, recreation and fish consumption, the specific impairments are violations of the general standard for benthics, E. coli, fecal coliform bacteria and mercury in fish tissue. The sources are municipal (Urbanized High Density Area) for the benthics impairment, agriculture, non-point sources and wildlife other than waterfowl for the bacterial impairments and contaminated sediment for the mercury impairment. Numerous TMDLs have been approved for this segment for each of the impairments and must be considered by the applicant.

Additionally, the 2007 Augusta County Comprehensive Plan lists the South River – Porterfield Run watershed as a Priority Watershed for Groundwater Protection

due to the presence of karst features and the location of Source Water Assessment Program zones.

This property lies outside of the Airport Overlay District (APO).

This property lies within Zone X on the FEMA FIRM and therefore is outside the Special Flood Hazard Area.

COMMENTS FROM ZONING ADMINISTRATOR: The property is currently surrounded by General Agriculture zoned properties. However, the adjoining parcel to the east contains an existing speedway. The parcel has an existing 7,200 square foot building permitted by Special Use Permit to have auctions. If the property is rezoned to General Business, the adjacent parcel to the north contains a single family dwelling and may be impacted by increased traffic, congestion, noise, lights, dust, odor, fumes, vibration, and visual impacts from additional permitted business uses.

Any new development would be subject to current setback regulations and a site plan meeting the requirements of **Section 25-673** is required to be approved prior to any business or industrial development on the property and any change or enlargement of existing structures or uses may require submittal of a revised site plan.

No development such as parking and vehicular passageways, or any other improvement other than open space and landscaping is permitted within twenty-five feet (25') of any side or rear lot line that joins property not zoned business. The area within the twenty-five foot area is also subject to the "buffer yard" requirements in section **25-387** and **25-308**. Outdoor lighting must meet all requirements of Article VI "Outdoor Lighting".

COMMENTS FROM ACSA: There is an existing 12" waterline along the front property line on East Side Highway. There is no public sewer available in the area of the subject property.

Water and Sewer Notes:

1. Water and sewer capacities are not reserved until system adequacy is determined (supply, treatment, transmission) and payment of the connection fees has been received in accordance with Service Authority Policy. Augusta County Service Authority Policies and Procedures can be found at <http://www.acsawater.com/opdm>.
2. Any engineering evaluations and upgrades or extensions would be the responsibility of the owner/developer and are subject to Service Authority review and approval.
3. Investigation of available fire flow is recommended to ensure that the system is capable of providing the needed fire flow to comply with Chapter 24 of the Augusta County Code requirements for the proposed use of the property. Any upgrades or extensions would be the responsibility of the owner/developer

and are subject to Service Authority review and approval. **Important Note:** The water system in this area is not capable of providing the needed fire flow to comply with Chapter 24 of the Augusta County Code requirements for the proposed use of the property. The owner is advised to discuss this with the County.

COMMENTS FROM HEALTH DEPARTMENT: Health department records show that a sewage disposal system construction permit (107-15-0020) was issued to Kenneth Bradley on 02/02/2015 for a system to serve an auction house with 1 full time employee, 4 part time employees and up to 100 patrons a day. We show this permit as having expired with no verification that the system was installed.

The health department does not object to the rezoning, but the owner will need to obtain approval for any sewage disposal system needs at the property. Any change in usage from the original plans would require further review.

COMMENTS FROM FIRE-RESCUE: Fire-Rescue sees little to no impact on service delivery from this request. Fire-Rescue has no further comment; however, this area does not have adequate fire flow available.

COMMENTS FROM VDOT:

1. The development of 8.0 acres with uses permitted by General Business (not including those excluded by proffer) should not substantially affect transportation on the surrounding roadways; therefore, a VDOT Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) is not recommended.
2. Any access to a state maintained roadway must be designed and constructed in accordance with Appendix F of the VDOT Road Design Manual. Each entrance must meet the Access Management spacing requirements (470' for full access). Based on the property frontage, it appears that two entrances could be permitted to serve the development. The first is already constructed and currently serves the auction facility. A second could be constructed approximately midway between the first and Al Gore Lane, maintaining the 470' spacing to each entrance. Turn lane warrants will be reviewed at time of site plan. Similarly, depending on the severity of the traffic generated, additional intersection/entrance improvements may be required, such as a signal or alternative intersection, which would be reviewed at time of site plan.
3. Partial access entrances will not be permitted along the 5-lane section of roadway unless a physical median is constructed.

4. A VDOT land use permit will be required for any work needing to be performed on State right of way.

SCHOOL BOARD STAFF COMMENTS: This request will have no impact on Cassell Elementary School, Wilson Middle School, and Wilson High School.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT STAFF COMMENTS:

Pros:

1. Proposed General Business zoning may be compatible with existing business use on this property (Special Use Permit for an auction house) and adjoining property to the east (Eastside Speedway).
2. Property is located in an Urban Service Area where the County wants to encourage future growth.
3. Property is located off Route 340, a designated thoroughfare.

Cons:

1. There is no public sewer available in the area. A septic system would require a waiver from the Board of Supervisors.
2. Water system in the area cannot provide the needed fire flow for compliance with Chapter 24 of the Augusta County Code, requiring a waiver from the Board of Supervisors.
3. Request may not be compatible with adjacent General Agriculture zoning.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

The Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map designates this parcel as Community Mixed Use with a proposed density of six to twelve dwelling units per acre and, on up to 40% of the total land area, retail and office uses and in some, but not all cases, industrial uses. While this request does not create a mixture of uses on the approx. 8.5 acre parcel of request, it does add General Business zoning to the much larger Community Mixed Use designated area to allow for the retail and office uses described in the Comprehensive Plan. In addition, it is likely that the business portion of a future mixed use development would have frontage on Route 340.

Since the Comprehensive Plan envisions this parcel and surrounding area for mixed use development, staff feels that certain uses that are permitted in General Business, such as motor vehicle repair and machine shops, may not be compatible with potential future residential uses. However, the proffers do exclude fast food establishments, gasoline retail outlets, and car washes which eliminates some uses that may not be compatible with surrounding future mixed use development.

The Augusta County Service Authority has identified public water is available to serve the property although a waiver of the fire flow requirements from the Board would be needed. There is no public sewer available to serve the parcel. Since this parcel is in the Urban Service Area, the Board would also need to approve a waiver for a septic system.

This parcel is in a growth area where the County wants to encourage future development, but at this time sewer is not available. For compliance with the Comprehensive Plan, staff recommends that public sewer be extended to serve future business development on the parcel of request. While staff has pointed out some concerns with the wide range of business uses permitted in General Business zoning and the potential impacts to future adjacent residential development (Community Mixed Use), staff does recommend approval of the request with the proffers for the following reasons: 1) Business development along Route 340 is a likely land use. 2) The adjacent parcel to the east has a public use overlay for a racetrack which has operated at this location for many years. 3) The parcel is in an Urban Service area where the County wants to encourage future development and business zoning is one component of the future land use designation for this parcel and surrounding area.

PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION: Recommend approval with proffer.

SUMMARY OF REQUEST: A request to rezone with proffer approximately 40 acres owned by Garland Jr., & Melony Easter and Garland & Evelyn Easter from General Agriculture to Single Family Residential. The property is located on the east side of Old Goose Creek Road, (Rt. 640) and approximately 1.04 of miles west of the intersection of Old Goose Creek Road (Rt. 640) and Lifecore Drive (Rt. 636) in Fishersville in the Wayne District.

PROPOSED PROFFER: The applicant has proffered the following road improvements if the development exceeds 42 residential units: pavement overlay on Old Goose Creek Road from the development's primary entrance to the intersection of Old Goose Creek Road and Route 250 and a signal analysis at the intersection of Rt. 250 and Old Goose Creek Road with the developer paying for the portion of any needed improvements, resulting from such analysis, and specifically attributable to the development.

VICINITY ZONING: Single Family Residential to the north and west and General Agriculture to the south and east.

PREVIOUS ZONING: Multi-Family (2011), General Business (2011)

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN PLANNING POLICY AREA/FUTURE LAND USE DESIGNATION: Urban Service Area/Medium Density Residential

SOILS: Not applicable.

COMMENTS FROM ENGINEER: Most any development of the property will potentially increase stormwater discharge. Stormwater management must be addressed per the provisions of the Augusta County Stormwater Ordinance.

Use of water quality protection measures listed in either the Virginia Stormwater Management Handbook or through the Virginia Stormwater Management BMP Clearinghouse will be required depending on the disturbed acreage. With respect to water quantity, all points of discharge must comply with the Adequate Channel provisions of 9VAC25-840-40 subdivision 19.

The applicant is advised to contact the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality for any requirements related to proposed work in wetland areas or adjacent to any streams.

This property drains to Christians Creek which is listed on the Virginia DEQ Draft 2014 Impaired Waters List. This impaired segment extends from the headwaters downstream to its confluence with Middle River. The impaired uses are recreation and aquatic life, the specific impairments are E. coli, fecal coliform and violations of the general benthics standard. The sources are municipal (Urbanized High Density Area), non-point sources and wildlife other than waterfowl. TMDLs are approved for the bacterial and benthic impairments and must be considered by the applicant. This segment is included in the EPA approved Christians Creek benthic TMDL (Federal TMDL ID # 24514) and the EPA approved Christians Creek bacteria TMDL (Federal TMDL ID # 9480).

This property lies within Zone X on the FEMA FIRM and therefore is outside the Special Flood Hazard Area.

Natural Resources Recommendations from the Comprehensive Plan

The 2007 Augusta County Comprehensive Plan recommends performance standards to protect natural resources. For Urban Service Areas, a riparian buffer of 35 feet on either side of a stream is encouraged, and where feasible, stormwater should not be piped through in a manner to short-cut the buffer. Additionally, floodplain areas should have no habitable structures, but should instead be utilized for greenways & recreation areas.

Portions of the site may contain slopes in excess of 25%. In Urban Service Areas, the Comprehensive Plan recommends avoidance of slopes >25%, especially associated with stream valleys.

Wetlands may or may not exist on the site. For Wetland areas, the Comprehensive Plan recommends provision of a 35 foot buffer from the edge of wetlands.

COMMENTS FROM ZONING ADMINISTRATOR: A portion of the proposed property is currently zoned Single Family Residential. Zoning does not feel that the request to rezone the remaining acreage would have an adverse impact on the adjacent parcels currently zoned Single Family Residential and General Agriculture.

COMMENTS FROM ACSA: There is an existing 6" waterline adjacent to and along Troxell Lane. To meet ACSA Standards for a public water system, upgrades/extensions should be anticipated for the proposed use. There is an existing 8" sewer line running through Tax Map #s 66-75 and 66-77.

Water and Sewer Notes:

1. Water and sewer capacities are not reserved until system adequacy is determined (supply, treatment, transmission) and payment of the connection fees has been received in accordance with Service Authority Policy. Augusta County Service Authority Policies and Procedures can be found at <http://www.acsawater.com/oppm>.
2. Any engineering evaluations and upgrades or extensions would be the responsibility of the owner/developer and are subject to Service Authority review and approval.
3. Investigation of available fire flow is recommended to ensure that the system is capable of providing the needed fire flow to comply with Chapter 24 of the Augusta County Code requirements for the proposed use of the property. Any upgrades or extensions would be the responsibility of the owner/developer and are subject to Service Authority review and approval.

COMMENTS FROM HEALTH DEPARTMENT: There are no objections to this request.

COMMENTS FROM FIRE-RESCUE: This request will have little to no impact on service delivery.

TRAFFIC:

Rt. 863 Old Goose Creek Rd

-AADT: No traffic count

-Posted Speed Limit: 25 mph (Rural Rustic)

-Functional Classification: Local

COMMENTS FROM VDOT:

1. Rt. 863 (formerly Rt. 636) was recently surface treated with Rural Rustic Funds. Typically, the goal is to limit development (growth) on Rural Rustic roadways. The geometric design standard used to complete the rural rustic project was based on an average daily traffic of 400 vehicles per day or less. VDOT does not have a current published traffic count, but, based on the number of existing dwellings, the existing traffic count on Rt. 863 is expected to be approximately 150 vehicles per day. Essentially, an additional twenty-five (25) developed dwellings (assumed 10 vpd per dwelling) would exceed the geometric design standard for the roadway.
2. The approximated existing traffic count was calculated based on the number of observed dwellings accessing Old Goose Creek. Additional unoccupied parcels appear to also exist. The traffic generation from the business near Rt. 250 was excluded due to there being a heavier pavement section near the intersection.
3. The portion being rezoned (12.62 acres) is not expected to warrant a VDOT low volume submission Traffic Impact Analysis at rezoning. However, it should be noted that the cumulative property area that could be developed, including that which is already zoned for residential use, totals approximately 40 acres. Although there are some topographic constraints

that may limit the density of the development, a 40 acre residential development is capable of generating traffic that could substantially affect Rt. 863 and the intersection at Rt. 250.

4. The sight distance for an intersection/entrance onto Rt. 863 will be a challenge for this property. The mainline of Rt. 863 will need to be modified to be compliant. A significant portion of a vertical curve will need to be lowered; due to the proximity to the railroad right of way, permits may also be required from both VDOT and the Railroad. The intersection will be designed in accordance with VDOT standards as provided in Appendix F of the VDOT Road Design Manual.
5. Any new street must be designed in accordance with the Secondary Street Acceptance Requirements (SSAR). The network must meet both VDOT and County connectivity requirements. A minimum of two external connections will be required unless an exception is granted. An emergency access to Troxell Ln. would be considered.
6. **Comment submitted 9/4/18 based on submitted proffer:** The proffered condition will allow mitigation of traffic impacts in the case that the entire 40 acres is developed more densely than currently estimated (42 units).

School Board Staff Comments: The request for a change of approximately 12.62 acres from General Agriculture to Single Family Residential would have little impact on these three (3) schools depending on the size of each lot developed for each dwelling.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT STAFF COMMENTS:

Pros:

1. There is additional capacity at the three school impacted by this request to handle additional student population.
2. Request is in compliance with the Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map which designates these parcels for Medium Density Residential development.
3. Request is compatible with adjacent zoning to the North and East.
4. Public water and sewer are available to serve the property, although upgrades/extensions to the public water system should be anticipated for the proposed use.
5. Property is located in an Urban Service Area where the County wants to encourage its future residential growth.

Cons:

1. Rt. 863 was recently surface treated with Rural Rustic Funds. Typically, the goal is to limit development (growth) on Rural Rustic roadways.
2. While the rezoning of the 12.6 acres does not warrant a traffic impact analysis, VDOT has pointed out that the cumulative development of all three parcels, approximately 40 acres, is capable of generating traffic that could substantially affect Rt. 863 and the intersection at Rt. 250.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT STAFF RECOMMENDATION: This request is in compliance with the Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map which designates these parcels for Medium Density Residential development. Each of these parcels is already partially zoned Single Family Residential and this request adds an additional 12.6 acres to the same zoning classification. While VDOT has pointed out that the cumulative development of all three parcels, approximately 40 acres, is capable of generating traffic that could substantially affect Rt. 863 and the intersection at Rt. 250, new proffer legislation precludes the County from assessing such impacts on the acreage already zoned Single Family Residential. Adjacent zoning and development to the northwest is compatible with the request. Staff recommends approval of the request (April 2018).

After consultation with the County Attorney, development of the approx. 40 acres can be considered "new residential development" as defined in the latest proffer legislation, applying to residential rezonings. While the majority of the 40 acres is already zoned Single Family Residential, development of that already zoned land cannot be done under the current zoning ordinance without a rezoning as the land does not have the needed road access. Rezoning the 12.6 acres, with the necessary road access, is needed to facilitate development of the existing zoned piece. For that reason, the applicant has submitted a proffer that creates a phased transportation improvement approach if the development exceeds 42 residential units. Staff feels that the proffered condition addresses VDOT's concerns and recommends approval of the request with the proffer (UPDATED 8/30/2018).

PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION: Recommend approval with proffer.

EASTER LOCATED ON THE EAST SIDE OF OLD GOOSE CREEK ROAD (ROUTE 640), APPROXIMATELY 1.04 MILES WEST OF THE INTERSECTION OF OLD GOOSE CREEK ROAD AND LIFECORE DRIVE (ROUTE 636) IN FISHERSVILLE IN THE WAYNE DISTRICT.

AN ORDINANCE to amend Chapter 25 "Zoning" of the Code of Augusta County, Virginia.

WHEREAS, application has been made to the Board of Supervisors to amend the Augusta County Zoning Maps,

WHEREAS, the Augusta County Planning Commission, after a public hearing, has made their recommendation to the Board of Supervisors,

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has conducted a public hearing,

WHEREAS, both the Commission and Board public hearings have been properly advertised and all public notice as required by the Zoning Ordinance and the Code of Virginia properly completed,

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has considered the application, the Planning Commission recommendation and the comments presented at the public hearing;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Supervisors that the Augusta County Zoning Maps be amended as follows:

Parcel numbers 75, 76, 77 on tax map number 66 containing approximately 40 acres is changed from General Agriculture to Single Family Residential with the following proffer:

- 1. The development of the approximately 40 acres is not expected to exceed 42 single family detached residential units (See Hamrick Engineering letter dates June 25, 2018). Old Goose Creek Road will only be improved by providing the intersection site distance required by VDOT for the construction of the 42 units. If the development exceeds 42 units, improvements to Old Goose Creek Road will include a pavement overlay (satisfying VDOT design guidelines) on the portion of Old Goose Creek Road from the development's primary entrance to the intersection of Old Goose Creek Road and Route 250. In addition, development exceeding 42 units shall require a signal analysis at the intersection of Rt. 250 and Old Goose Creek Road and the developer shall be responsible for the portion of any needed improvements resulting from such analysis attributable to the development of the approx. 40 acres.**
