On December 4, 2018, in accordance with Section 58.1-3981 of the Code of Virginia, the Commissioner of Revenue delivered a memorandum reporting that she has confirmed through the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs that John C. Groome, Jr. has qualified for 100% disability since tax year 2015.

Under the provisions of Section 58.1-3980 of the Code of Virginia, a taxpayer may apply for a correction of the current and three (3) previous years of taxation. The County previously refunded the 2018 taxes based on a Benefit Summary Letter from the Department of Veterans Affairs dated December 1, 2017. Subsequently, Mr. Groome has provided letters which cover the tax years 2015, 2016, and 2017, the years he is now qualified as 100% disabled. She has certified that the sum of \$4,061.16 was overpaid due to the exemption from real estate taxes provided to disabled veterans under the provisions of §58.1-3219.5 of the Code. She has requested that the Board of Supervisors authorize the Treasurer to refund the sum overpaid.

AMBULANCE PROCUREMENT

The Board considered a request to purchase one ambulance.

Funding Source: 80000-8057 \$245,298.00

Timothy K. Fitzgerald, County Administrator, stated that Board of Supervisor approval is needed to purchase one ambulance based off of the Ambulance Replacement Plan.

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AMBULANCE PROCUREMENT (CONT'D)

This was previously discussed and determined there would be a few ambulances surpluses in order to help with the Rescue Squad Assistance Grant. There is a second ambulance needed and funded through the Capital Account. It is requested to fund \$245,298.00 to purchase one ambulance and then apply for the purchase of a second ambulance through the Rescue Squad Assistance Fund Grant.

Mr. Kelley moved, seconded by Mr. Shull that the Board approve the purchase of one ambulance and apply for the Rescue Squad Assistance Fund for the second.

Ms. Bragg asked what would be done with the old ambulances.

Mr. Fitzgerald stated they would be sold. One of the reason for being unsuccessful with grants in the past is due to having a surplus of ambulances. Those surplus ambulances are old and need to be replaced.

Mr. Shull pointed out that this seems like a large sum of money, but the new equipment and new requirements for the new ambulances is expensive.

GOVERNMENT CENTER ROOF REPLACEMENT PROJECT

The Board considered awarding the contract to Don Largent Roofing.

Funding Source: 80000-8198 Building Depreciation Account \$309,810.00

Rusty Sprouse, Director of Facilities Manager, stated that an invitation to bid was advertised for the roof project. Bid included cost options for both ballast roof and selfadhered roof. Mr. Sprouse showed pictures of the current roof system. It is a ballasted roof system on the flat end of the Government Center. Portions of the roof have vegetation growing on it. The stone breaks down and creates fines and allows vegetation to grow in the roof. Vegetation is also growing around the roof drains. Advantages to a ballast roof are cost, quick to install and the ballast help extend the life by protecting from weather or sharp objects dropped. Ballast roof can be difficult to find leaks, it degrades over time, and walking on a ballasted rood can cause additional leaks and stone ballast catch dirt and debris which can cause water to stand on the roof structure. Self-adhered roof advantages are maintenance cost are less, there is less weight on the roof structure, and the roof system is flat and self-adhered is a much cleaner installation. Self-adhered roofing is more costly to install and it takes longer. Mr. Sprouse recommends the selfadhered option. Over the past 12 months \$1,183.02 has been spent on repairs to the current roof of the Government Center. It is recommended to award the contract to Don Largent Roofing for self-adhered roof. Total cost for the project is \$309,810.00 and this includes a 10% contingency.

Mr. Shull moved, seconded by Mr. Coleman that the Board accept the bid as presented.

Ms. Carter asked how many square feet would be replaced.

Mr. Sprouse stated the Government Center roof is approximately 37,000 square feet and the Extension Office is approximately 3,200 square feet.

COMMISSIONER OF REVENUE TAX PROGRAM

Presentation by Commissioner on Tax Relief for the Elderly and Disabled, Tax Exemption for Disabled Veterans, and Lan Use Taxation programs.

Jean Shrewsbury, Commissioner of Revenue, reviewed the current scale that is used for Tax Relief for the Elderly. It was compared with the current median household income in Augusta County and also the Housing and Urban Development median housing for the County. Ms. Shrewsbury has determined that the current scale is an adequate scale to use for the next reassessment. A decision by the Board will need to be made by January 1, 2019.

Mr. Garber asked if the Financial Net Worth was determined by the State.

Ms. Shrewsbury stated that in 2014 it was turned over to the locality for determination. It has always been the localities decision, but the upper limit was set by the State. The last upper limit that was set by the State for Augusta County was \$100,000.00 in net worth. Net worth does not include the value of the house and five acres.

Mr. Garber stated that it's always difficult to have anything that fits all. A person can starve to death on one hundred acres in Augusta County if you're ninety years old. A person can't eat net worth.

Mr. Shull asked how other localities compare to Augusta County.

Ms. Shrewsbury stated that she would provide a comparison chart to the Board at a future meeting.

Mr. Garber requested that Ms. Shrewsbury prepare a comparison of other localities and present it to the Board at the Staff Briefing on November 26, 2018.

Ms. Shrewsbury stated the values for land use this year went up from the values adopted in 2014. In 2014 most land in Augusta County would fall in soil class three and four. The current value for class three is 440 and for class four it is 350. She recommends increasing class three to 620 and class four to 490. These values are based on the income approach. This is the Commissioner of Revenue recommendation and is not something that requires a Board of Supervisor vote.

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BROADBAND GRANT

The Board considered committee recommendations for VATI 2019 grant application(s).

Funding Source: 80000-8198 \$309,810.00

Jennifer Whetzel, Deputy County Administrator, stated that the Broadband Committee seeks Board approval to apply for the 2019 VATI Grant. The Broadband Committee was established by the Board with seven members appointed by each district. There has been two meetings to date, one in October and one in November. A mission has been set and will be placed on the website.

The 2019 VATI Grant is administered by the Department of Housing and Community Development. It requires a shovel ready project and 20% local match. There is a public comment period of fifteen days. If approved to move forward, the public comment period will be advertised and the goal will be to end the comment period on December 7, 2018. The grant application is due December 14, 2018. DHCD added a challenge process at their level. A private provider partner is required and a contract with the provider is due by May 2019. The project must be completed by May 2020. DHCD added a definition to under unserved. It has to be a household that is not getting more than 10mb download and 1 upload and if 10% of households are served by the same vendor then the application could not be submitted. Proposal evaluation criteria is to demonstrate a need, demonstrate the benefit to the community, provide a speed of greater than 10.3, implement the project within the timeline and have the financial viability to complete the project. The two projects are Middlebrook Fiber and Deerfield Fiber. The Middlebrook project is 5.3 miles of fiber from the Arbor Hill tower to Middlebrook village making fiberto-the-home available to households within 250 feet from the road along the route. The estimated cost is \$347,425.00. If an 80/20 grant is awarded, \$277,940.00 would be paid with a match of \$34,743.00 and if a 70/30 grant is awarded, \$243,198.00 would be paid with a match of \$52,114,00. The Deerfield Fiber project is 11,500 foot of middle mile fiber and 15,500 foot of FTTH along Deerfield valley Road and Marble Valley Road proposing fiber-to-the-home connections along the route. The Estimated cost is \$233,000.00. If an 80/20 grant is awarded, \$186,000.00 would be paid with a match of \$23,300.00 and if a 70/30 grant is awarded, \$163,000.00 would be paid with a match of \$34,950.00. The public comment period would start on November 15 and end on December 7. Funding The Broadband Committee recommends submitting applications for both projects. The funding would come from the Economic Development Capital account.

J.R. Lawhorne, Chairman of the Broadband Committee, stated that this is a compelitive grant program and he is in favor of applying for the grant.

Ms. Carter moved, seconded by Dr. Paltie that the Board approve allocating \$87,064.00 to support both projects at the rate of 30%.

Mr. Fitzgerald stated that Ms. Shrewsbury would not be able to derive at that number because she has no idea who may qualify. The only way for the Commissioner to know who is eligible is if they apply.

Mr. Garber agrees with Dr. Pattie on increasing the acreage to from five to ten. It will not have a huge impact for the County, but it will impact the citizens greatly.
