Thank you for your interest in Augusta County's Volunteer Fire-Rescue Services! Augusta County Emergency Personnel work together to provide Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Care to the citizens.

Each of our volunteer agencies has a primary run area of the county in which they respond to emergency calls. In the year 2000, the fire and rescue services responded 14,367 times. The area fire-rescue services is also trained in hazardous material incidents, vehicle extrication, water rescue, and many more.

To join a volunteer fire department or rescue squad in Augusta County, start by filling out the enclosed application. Then choose three individuals to be personal references for you and provide them with the attached reference forms. Please also have the Permission for Release of Information form notarized. Next, fill out the Criminal History Record Check form. Then simply turn in your application, Criminal History Record Check form to Minday M. Craun, Volunteer Coordinator for the Augusta County Fire-Rescue System.

Augusta County Fire-Rescue System

Augusta County's first fire department was formed in 1923 in Weyers Cave Virginia, the Weyers Cave Fire Department; and the first rescue squad was formed in 1938 in the Staunton area to serve Staunton and Augusta County, known as the Staunton-Augusta Rescue Squad. A central dispatch system was put into place in 1976 at the Augusta County Fire Department on Richmond Avenue and then moved to the Government Center in Verona in 1990. Today, there are 30 fire and rescue agencies that serve the citizens of Augusta County.

Agencies:

Augusta County is served by a total of 30 agencies. Some of them perform only fire related duties, some only EMS related duties and there are a few that house both fire and rescue within the same building. In recent years, many of the fire departments have assumed the duties of EMS, called a first response program. This is a program that fire departments respond to life threatening calls along with the rescue squads. Below is a list of the agencies that serve Augusta County starting with the combination fire and rescue, then fire stations, rescue squads and a list of stations that serve Augusta County but are not located in Augusta County.

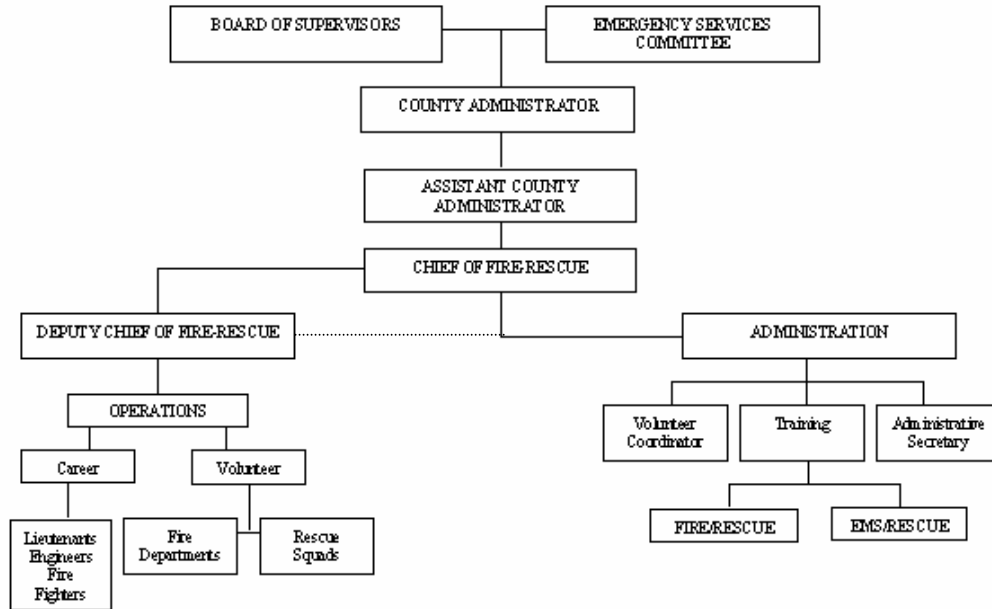

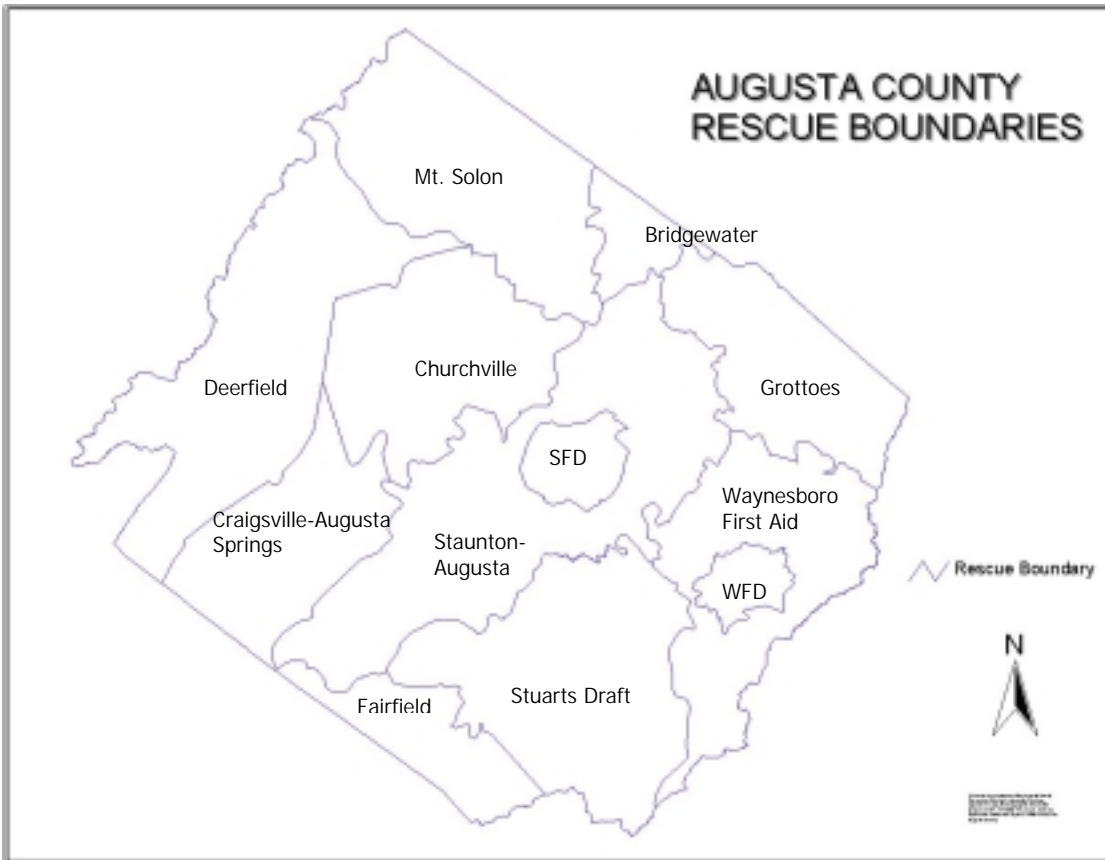
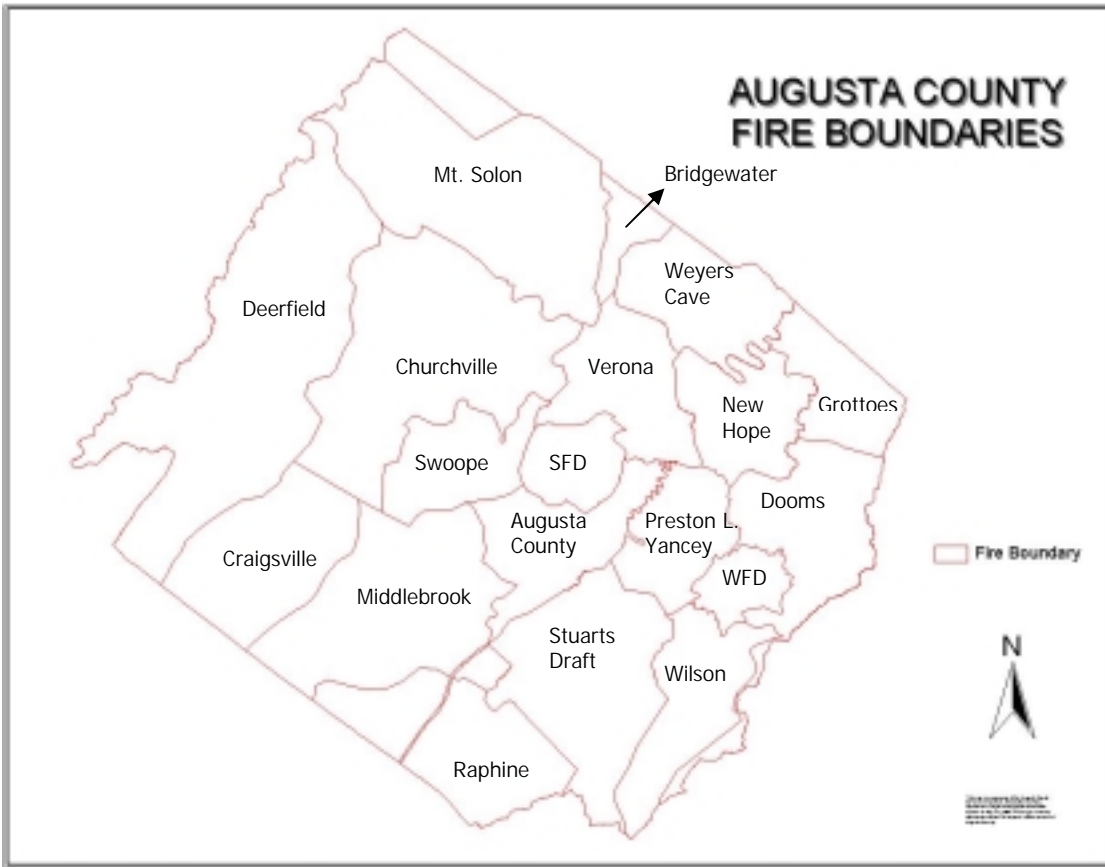

Augusta County Fire-Rescue Services Volunteer Membership

Benefits

(Benefits are subject to change from time to time without notice)

Augusta County offers the following benefits for each active volunteer member.

- ❑ *County Tags* – Volunteers are permitted reimbursement for one county tag for the primary vehicle used by the volunteer when yearly requirements are met.
- ❑ *Personal Property Tax Reimbursement* – This program allows for reimbursement of \$50 towards your vehicle that is used on emergency responses. This program is under investigation for replacement with a retirement program.
- ❑ *Volunteer Appreciation Day* – This is recognition for the volunteer fire and rescue workers that serve the citizens of Augusta County. This event is held in September of each year and is for the volunteer member and his/her family.
- ❑ *DMV Fire Department or Rescue Squad Plates* – Members may receive license plates through the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles. To receive these plates, a special form verifying membership with your volunteer agency must be signed by your Chief and/or Captain before these license plates will be issued by DMV. Forms can be picked up at the Volunteer Coordinators Office.
- ❑ *Federal and State Tax Opportunities* – There may be federal and state tax opportunities available to you as a volunteer member with Augusta County Fire-Rescue Services. Your tax advisor could best inform you of the current rules, regulations, policies and laws pertaining to charitable donations to volunteer services.
- ❑ *Hepatitis-B Vaccination Program* – This program is provided free of charge to all Augusta County Fire-Rescue members after completion of an EMS certification Course. More information can be obtained from the EMS Training Coordinators Office.
- ❑ *Flu Shots Program* – This program is provided free of charge to all active Augusta County Fire-Rescue members during the start of Flu Season. This is on a first come first serve basis, for more information, please contact the Volunteer Coordinators Office.
- ❑ *Accidental and Health Insurance* – If you are injured while on duty, accidental and health insurance is provided through the insurance policy carried by the County of Augusta.
- ❑ *Restaurant Discounts* – Many fast food restaurants give discounts for emergency providers while on duty. Please ask your volunteer agency for a list of what restaurants are eligible.
