


Augusta County Electoral Board
Draft "Approved" Meeting/Work Session Minutes
April 14, 2022 3:00pm
South Board Room, Augusta County Government Center

- I. Call to Order. The meeting/work session was called to order at 3:00pm. Present were: Marcy Reedy, Chair; Dave Leatherwood, Vice-Chair; and Georgia Alvis-Long, Secretary.
- II. Reading and Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting. Dave moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the March 30th Electoral Board meeting and to approve them as prepared.

 - A. Selecting Chiefs, Assistant Chiefs, and Officers of Election to staff precincts for the June 21, 2022 Primary.

After much deliberation approximately (¾) three quarters of the precincts were appropriately staffed. As of today, not all Officers have responded with their acceptance or declination of appointment. Once this has been established the remaining positions will be filled. The goal is to have the complete slate of Officers selected by early May.
