Utah Nonresident Concealed Carry Permit

Ages 21+

The Utah Concealed Firearm Permit (CFP) is one of the most sought-after permits because with it law-abiding citizens may legally carry a firearm concealed in 39 states. The Utah CFP course is classroom based and taught by NRA certified & Utah BCI certified instructors. Course instruction includes the following topics: Utah criminal and traffic code, U.S. federal firearms regulations, BCI administration policy, practical and legal considerations and more. Although this is NOT a live fire course and range time is not required, participants are encouraged to cultivate their marksmanship skills by scheduling one-on-one firearms training at the range with a qualified instructor. Class cost includes a course completion certificate, instruction on obtaining your FBI fingerprinting (which is required by the Utah Bureau of Criminal Identification) and passport photo service to help expedite the submitting of your application. Each course participant packet contains course handouts of material covered, a blue FBI fingerprint card and a Utah Non-Resident CFP application. Any U.S. citizen may apply for a non-resident Utah CFP after taking this required course. Before applying for the Utah CFP, you must obtain a concealed carry permit from your home state. Once applying for the Utah CFP a criminal background check will be conducted. Please do not bring guns to class. Instructor is Jim Wood, NRA & Utah BCI Certified Instructor. 





Our campground is designed and managed for 'family-style' camping and we encourage all campers to consider this when making reservations or plans to stay with us.

REGISTRATION

Participants must register before the start of all programs; you are not considered registered for a program unless payment is made in full. Augusta County Parks and Recreation's programs have a minimum and maximum number of participants. Registration is accepted on a first-come, first paid basis until a program is full. Once a program is full, ACPR may take names for a waiting list but does not guarantee anyone on a waiting list acceptance into a program. ACPR reserves the right to cancel a program due to lack of enrollment. In such a case, enrollees will be promptly notified of the cancellation. You may register online, by mail, by phone, or in person at our office.

PAYMENT

Payment in full is due at the time of registration, unless the specific activity/trip/program description outlines an otherwise approved payment schedule that includes an initial deposit. You may pay by check, cash, Visa, MasterCard, or Discover. Please do not send cash with mail in registrations. All checks and money orders are payable to Augusta County Parks and Recreation or ACPR. A \$30 return check fee is charged for all returned checks.

ONLINE REGISTRATION TIPS

You may register for our programs online using WebTrac. Go to www.augustarec.com and click on "Online Registration". This will take you to our online registration system.

Once you get to WebTrac follow these steps:

Step 1: Sign in with your username and password or create a new account. If you can't remember your username or password, just click "Need your username/password?" and your information will be sent to the email address associated with your account.

Step 2: Find the activity you desire, check for additional information and availability, then register!

Note: after clicking the shopping cart icon to register for an activity, a window will appear at the bottom of your screen. Click on "Enroll Now" and you will be taken through the payment process.



REFUNDS & CANCELLATIONS

Full refunds will be given if Augusta County Parks and Recreation cancels a class, program, trip, etc. With any registration cancellation, a \$10 cancellation fee will be retained (or the full fee if less than \$10).

For activity and class programs (non-trips), refunds will be given up until 5 business days prior to when a program begins, minus the \$10 cancellation fee. If pre-purchases have been made, these costs will also be deducted from the refund. No refunds will be approved after this date unless special circumstances warrant.

For all trip programs, no refunds will be given, unless your space on the trip can be filled. If a waiting list exists, ACPR will contact those on the waiting list to try to fill the space(s). If no waiting list exists OR those on the waiting list no longer want to participate in the trip, it will be the responsibility of the participant to resell their space(s) on the trip. In many cases, the department must make pre-purchases; therefore, this refund policy is not flexible. Note that the \$10 cancellation fee will apply, even if the space is filled.

OVERNIGHT TRIP POLICY

For all overnight trips a minimum of \$75 deposit per person is required to reserve your space. Deposits are non-refundable unless the trip is cancelled by ACPR. If a person from a double/triple room withdraws from the trip or fails to pay the balance, it will be the responsibility of the remaining roommate(s) to pay the difference on the new room rate.


Appeals of assessed values of real estate before the Board of Equalization started in June and have been running smoothly. Thank you to those who scheduled their appeal before the September 1 deadline.



ACFR IS ASKING FOR YOUR HELP TO SAVE LIVES AND PROPERTY. JOIN THE ADOPT-A-HYDRANT PROGRAM.

Augusta County Fire-Rescue (ACFR) is asking for your help in keeping fire hydrants that are close to your home or business clear of snow in the winter and free of weeds and shrubbery in the summer by participating in the Adopt-A-Hydrant program.

To take part in the Adopt-A-Hydrant Program, Fire-Rescue asks that you:

- Shovel the area around the fire hydrant after each snowfall. Clear the area approximately three (3) feet around the hydrant as well as a path from the street or roadway to the fire hydrant so that the hydrant is visible and accessible.
- During the summer months, please make sure that the same three-foot path around the hydrant is free of weeds, shrubbery, flowerbeds, etc and can be seen easily.



SMOKE ALARM AND CARBON MONOXIDE SAFETY

- Make sure you have a good working smoke alarm that is not older than 10 years
- Check the batteries monthly by pressing the test button
- · Keep the alarm clean and free of dust and dirt
- Carbon Monoxide alarms should be used in your home if you have any appliances that use some type of gas or have a flame
- Carbon Monoxide alarms should be placed near your sleeping quarters so that you can hear the alarm if it alerts you



TOP TIPS FOR HEATING SAFETY



- Have chimneys and furnaces cleaned and or inspected at the start of the season
- Fireplace ashes are placed outdoors in a metal container at least three feet from house and make sure they are cold before leaving them
- If you use any type of heating appliance/heaters make sure they are approved by a national testing lab and have a tip over shut off feature
- Do not use electrical cords with heaters

TOP TIPS FOR HALLOWEEN SAFETY

- Carry glow sticks for flashlights; use reflective tape of stickers
- Costumes should be light and easy to see by vehicles, make sure it fits to help with trips and falls, think about face paint over mask, nothing should obscure vision
- Kids 12 and under should be accompanied by an adult
- Try out a Trunk or Treat event instead of walking the street



TOP TIPS FOR THANKSGIVING COOKING SAFETY



- Keep your cooking area free from items that can catch fire
- Do not leave cooking unattended on the stove, stay in the kitchen when cooking
- Do not cook when extremely tired
- Keep small children at least three feet from the stove

TOP TIPS FOR DECORATING FOR THE HOLIDAYS & TREE SAFETY

- If using a real live tree, make sure you keep plenty of water in the base and check it regularly
- Do not use real candles around live trees
- Hang breakable ornament at the top if you have small children
- Keep poisonous holiday plants out of reach of children and pets (Poison Control Center 1-800-222-1222)
- Turn off lights before leaving your home or going to sleep and check them regularly for exposed for frayed wires
