WHEREAS, by resolution adopted on January 27, 2016, the Board of Supervisors confirmed the Declaration:

WHEREAS, all coordinated local government action has been taken and it is no longer necessary for the Declaration to remain in effect; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors desires to terminate the Declaration, and to approve, ratify and confirm all actions taken by the Emergency Management Co-Director and County staff pursuant to the Declaration and the approved plans of the County of Augusta.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF AUGUSTA COUNTY, VIRGINIA that all actions taken by the Emergency Management Co-Director and County staff pursuant to the Declaration and the approved plans of the County of Augusta be, and hereby are, approved, ratified and confirmed.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Declaration be, and hereby is, terminated, effective February 10, 2016.

WHEREAS, the County may determine that the funds advanced and to be advanced to pay Expenditures will be reimbursed to the County and/or the School Board from the proceeds of one or more taxable or tax-exempt obligations to be issued by the County (the "Indebtedness"); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF AUGUSTA COUNTY, VIRGINIA (THE "BOARD"):

- 1. The Board hereby adopts this declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 and declares that the County intends to reimburse itself and/or the School Board with the proceeds of Indebtedness for Expenditures made on, after or within 60 days prior to the date hereof with respect to the Projects, except that Expenditures made more than 60 days prior to the date hereof may be reimbursed as to certain de minimis or preliminary expenditures described in Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2(f) and as to other expenditures permitted under applicable Treasury Regulations.
- 2. The maximum principal amount of Indebtedness expected to be issued for the Projects is \$45,000,000.
 - 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Purpose

To provide the personnel a procedure for enrolling in Augusta County sponsored training classes.

Standard Operating Procedure

- 1. Class will be officially announced three different ways:
 - a. Announcement will be placed in the electronic packet for each department for distribution prior to the Augusta County Officers Association.
 - b. Announcement will be emailed to all In-County agencies utilizing the contacts provided on the annual officer forms submitted to ACFR Administration. The announcement will also be sent to the Augusta County career staff to be posted in their respective stations.
 - c. Announcement will be placed on the Fire-Rescue website.
 - d. Announcement will be faxed to each station.
- 2. When possible departments within Augusta County will get the announcement and have two weeks to register their personnel before the announcement is distributed to outside agencies.
- 3. A current Augusta County registration form will need to be filled out by each prospective student. The current version is available on the Fire-Rescue website.
- 4. When registering for an Augusta County Fire Rescue sponsored training event, the following process shall be followed in order to accurately track and respond to course registrations:
 - a. Once the course announcement has been made, the student will log on to the Augusta County website at www.co.augusta.va.us, click on Departments and Services and then click on Fire Rescue. Once on the Fire Rescue page, click on Training and scroll to the middle of the page. You will find a highlighted link to a fillable/faxable registration form and you will need to click here.

- b. Once the link is opened, fill out the form completely and click the "Submit Form" button at the bottom of the page. Once you click the submit button, the registration is automatically emailed to the Training Division.
- c. Once the registration is received by the ACFR Training Division, it can be immediately processed and a return email will be generated, as soon as possible, to the individual submitting the registration that will indicate the student has been registered or is on a waiting list for the course.
- d. If you are unable to send the registration by the means listed above, it is acceptable to print the fillable form and fax it to the ACFR Training Division at 540-245-5171.
- e. If you are unable to use the electronic registration or print and fax the fillable form, registrations completed by hand will be accepted. This should be as a last resort only due to the legibility of the forms.
- f. When completing any registration form, it is important that it is completed entirely, including contact number and email address. This is how contact is made verifying course registration. At any point there are questions or issues with the registration process, please contact the ACFR Training Division.
- 5. Registration forms will need to be submitted by the closing date noted on the course announcement. Registrations received after the deadline are subject to rejection if logistical needs cannot be met. An example of this would be the additional registrations would exceed the capacity of the classroom or the available instructor resources. If the course fills before the closing date, registrations will be accepted as they came in and placed on a waiting list.
- 6. Class minimums or maximums will be strictly enforced as noted on the announcement.
- 7. Student's email address and phone numbers will be required. If not on the form, we cannot accept registration.
- 8. After the closing date, registration forms will be compiled and confirmation will be sent by email/mail that an individual is in the class if it was not done upon submission. Several criteria will be used to select students.
- 9. In-county volunteers or career staff will be accepted on a "first come, first serve" basis. All registration forms will be date and time stamped when received. If several registrations are received on the same date and time, enrollment will be determined by alphabetizing last name.
- 10. Out of county agencies with first due area in Augusta County will then be accepted on a "first come, first serve" basis.
- 11. Out of county agencies will then be admitted to fill the class if space is available.
- 12. All certification courses will have a registration fee associated with them. If the student is an Augusta County volunteer/career member, the fee will not be charged as long as the student completes the program. However, if the student drops out of the program prior to the completion date, the course fee will be charged to the student's agency or the student directly if they are a career member. All out-of-county students will be charged the fee at the beginning of the course.

BURNING EXERCISES

Scope

This procedure is intended to prescribe the management of all classes where actual fires are used, either in acquired structures or the Burn Building at the Fire Training Center.

Standard for Live Fire Training Exercises

The Augusta County Fire Rescue Chief or his/her designee shall be notified and consulted with before the burning of any acquired structure, whether as a controlled burn or for live training.

All burning exercises, regardless of the type of structure, shall follow the NFPA 1403 Standard (current edition) in its' entirety as a minimum. This shall also include all associated documents identified within the standard. Exercises utilizing the Burn Building at the Fire Training Center will follow the section of NFPA 1403 governing such use. Exercises using acquired structures shall follow that section of NFPA 1403 in its entirety. No one shall have the authority to disregard any safety guidelines contained therein. Prior to the burning of any acquired structure, all necessary documentation must be obtained by the hosting agency and must be on file with the department conducting the training. A copy of these documents shall also be forwarded to the Augusta County Fire Rescue Administration Office at least one week prior to the exercise taking place. The ACFR Training Division can assist with necessary documentation if needed.

General

All burning of acquired structures will be coordinated with the ACFR Training Division. No companies will be taken totally out of service for training drills.

When conducting live burn exercises in Augusta County (acquired structure or burn building), the use of all instructors shall follow the current administrative guideline established by the Virginia Department of Fire Programs as it relates to the Firefighter Level I program. These requirements can be found on the VDFP website at www.vafire.com. This shall include the minimum qualifications, the identified student/instructor ratio, and task specific instructors.

<u>Safety</u>

Safety should be a primary concern at any training drill, and especially so at any live fire training drill. A Safety Officer will be appointed at any drill where actual fires are used.

The Safety Officer shall have the authority to instruct any student or instructor, no matter their rank, to operate in a manner consistent with safety. The Safety Officer will also have the authority to stop any exercise or any part of any exercise that is, in his opinion, unsafe until corrections are made.

Jr. Members in Live Fire Training Exercises

The State Child Labor laws are very specific in regard to Junior Firefighters. Any firefighter under the age of 18 is not allowed to enter any structure where any part of the structure is involved in fire unless they are currently certified as Firefighter Level I or higher under the NFPA 1001 standard. The exception to this is when they are entering a non-combustible building as part of the Firefighter Level I training program. Reference – Code of Virginia Labor and Employment Law section 40.1-79.1.

Burn Building

Any company can schedule the use of the Burn Building by contacting the ACFR Training Division. ACFR will provide a qualified burn building operator at no cost to the agency. The agency using the building will be responsible for scheduling the proper number of qualified instructors to conduct the training and meet the NFPA 1403/VDFP Firefighter Level I requirements. The ACFR Fire Training Officer can assist with this if necessary. During any live fire training exercise held at the ACFR burn building, there shall be a minimum of 1 BLS EMS transport unit, with a dedicated crew, on site at all times. In the event this cannot be arranged, notification shall be made to the Fire Training Captain for further assistance at least 72 hours in advance. Any and all possible assistance will be given to ensure the training can be completed.
