



WHEREAS, there is a strong body of research that supports specific tools that all Americans can use to better handle challenges, and protect their health and well-being; and


WHEREAS, mental illnesses are real and prevalent in our nation; and

# COUNTY OF AUGUSTA STAFF REPORT Cynthia Roberts, Wendell Paul Alexander, And Maury Mill Townhomes, LLC January 12, 2016 Revised: January 13, 2016

**SUMMARY OF REQUEST:** A request to rezone from General Agriculture to Attached Residential approximately 5.6 acres owned by Cynthia Roberts and Wendell Paul Alexander and Maury Mill Townhomes LLC, located on the north side of Maury Mill Road (Rt. 813), less than 0.1 of a mile west of the intersection with Rolla Mill Road (Rt. 1930) in Verona in the North River District.

#### **PROPOSED PROFFERS:**

- 1. Prior to the issuance of a building permit for any dwelling unit on this property, a 6' solid vinyl privacy fence will be constructed along the property boundaries as generally depicted on the Rezoning Exhibit prepared by Balzer and Associates and dated 12-16-15. The fence shall be permanently maintained.
- 2. No more than 42 units will be built on the 5.6 acres.

**VICINITY ZONING:** General Agriculture to the east and west; and Single Family Residential (10) to the north and south.

PREVIOUS ZONING: General Agriculture

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN PLANNING POLICY AREA/FUTURE LAND USE DESIGNATION: Urban Service Area: Medium Density Residential

SOILS: Not Applicable

**COMMENTS FROM ENGINEER:** Most any development of the property will potentially increase stormwater discharge. Stormwater management must be addressed per the provisions of the Augusta County Stormwater Ordinance.

Use of water quality protection measures listed in either the Virginia Stormwater Management Handbook or through the Virginia Stormwater Management BMP Clearinghouse will be required depending on the disturbed acreage. With respect to water quantity, all points of discharge must comply with the Adequate Channel provisions of 9VAC25-840-40 subdivision 19. Adequate channel could be a particular concern for this site as the northern portion of the site drains onto lots in an existing subdivision with no apparent drainage improvements and the southern portion of the site drains to a small roadside ditch along Maury Mill Rd.

2. Any engineering evaluations and upgrades or extensions would be the responsibility of the owner/developer and are subject to Service Authority

review and approval.

3. Investigation of available fire flow is recommended to ensure that the system is capable of providing the needed fire flow to comply with the Augusta County Fire/Rescue requirements for the proposed use of the property. Any upgrades or extensions would be the responsibility of the owner/developer and are subject to Service Authority review and approval.

**COMMENTS FROM HEALTH DEPARTMENT:** Public utilities serve this property. Any existing private wells on the property that will no longer be used should be properly abandoned. A health department permit would be required.

**COMMENTS FROM FIRE-RESCUE:** This request will have little to no impact on service delivery for this area, however, the current owners need to ensure that there is adequate fire flow for this project.

TRAFFIC:

Rt. 813 Maury Mill Road AADT: 220 vpd (2013) Posted Speed Limit: 25 mph Functional Classification: local

#### **COMMENTS FROM VDOT:**

1. 42 units are expected to impact the adjacent roadway by nearly doubling the existing AADT. The existing pavement section of Rt. 813 could be negatively impacted by the additional daily traffic and construction traffic during build-out. The warrants are not met for a Chapter 527 Traffic Impact Analysis.

2. Any access to a State maintained roadway must be in accordance with Appendix F of the VDOT Road Design Manual. A commercial entrance would be required to access the site. The frontage supports at least one entrance location that would meet the VDOT sight distance requirements.

4 units per acre. The applicant is requesting a rezoning for townhouse residential development with a proffered maximum of 42 units (a density of 7.5 units per acre). Rezoning this land to Attached Residential will leave a small parcel to the east (less than 1 acre in size) zoned General Agriculture completely surrounded by residential zonings.


Public water and sewer are available to serve the property, although system improvements are likely. Two out of the three schools impacted by this request have the program capacity to handle the additional students generated by this request, although Clymore Elementary School will be at or nearing its program capacity. Development will double the traffic on Maury Mill Road.

This property is likely to develop in the future, however, this request is not compatible with the Comprehensive Plan nor the surrounding development. Staff recommends the request to Attached Residential not be approved. Staff could support a rezoning to Single Family Residential.

**PLANNING COMMISSION'S RECOMMENDATION:** Recommend denial of the request.



The budget for the project is as follows:



RE: Consideration of a Marketing and Rezoning Agreement for Blue Mountain

Investment, LLC

As you will recall, over the past couple of years we have been working with Mr. Gary Blosser to determine how to best market his approximately 500 acres located near the Shenandoah Valley Regional Airport in the Middle River District. The site has enormous economic development potential and is slated for industrial use in the County's comprehensive plan.

Several challenges associated with the property have limited its marketing potential in recent years, including the lack of a set purchase price, the lack of local government control, and the lack of the appropriate zoning for development. To overcome these challenges, staff has worked with Mr. Blosser to finalize a Marketing and Rezoning Agreement (attached). This agreement resolves the previous challenges by establishing a set purchase price for the property as a whole over the next two years, establishing joint marketing responsibility between the county and the owner, and setting a schedule for rezoning the majority of the property to industrial and 20 acres of the property to Airport Business. In lieu of an annual option fee, Mr. Blosser has agreed

### REZONING AND MARKETING AGREEMENT

THIS REZONING AND MARKETING AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is entered into as of this 11th day of May, 2016 (the "Effective Date"), by and between Blue Mountain Investments, L.L.C. a Virginia limited liability company ("Owner), the County of Augusta, Virginia, a Political Subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia ("the County"), and the Augusta County Economic Development Authority, a Political Subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia (the Authority).

#### RECITALS:

- A. Owner is seized and possessed with title to certain tracts of land, together with all improvements and fixtures located thereon and all easements and other appurtenant rights (collectively, the "Property"), containing approximately 530 acres of land located in Augusta County, Virginia, as more particularly identified and described on Exhibit "A" and depicted on a map marked Exhibit "B," both of which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- B. The Property is identified as a site for future industrial development in the County's Comprehensive Plan.
- C. The County's Board of Supervisors desires to assist the Owner with rezoning the Property and market it as an industrial development site.
- D. The County's Board of Supervisors also desires that the Owner not suffer the payment of roll-back taxes on the Property in the land use taxation program due to the Board of Supervisors' rezoning effort. Also, the Board of Supervisors desires that the Owner not incur an increased tax burden due to the Property being zoned Industrial and Airport Business, as long as

withdraw the Property from rezoning if such modifications or amendments, in Owner's sole judgment and discretion, negatively affect Owner's use of the Property or its ability to market the Property. The parties agree no roll back taxes will be assessed against the Property due to the County-initiated rezoning. The parties further agree that the Property will be used for agricultural purposes, and that the Property shall remain in the Land Use Program and real estate taxes shall be assessed at the rate pursuant to such use until such time as the Property is sold or fails to meet the qualification requirements for the Land Use Program. For the purposes of this Agreement, "sold" shall mean a transfer or conveyance of title to an independent third party purchaser for full fair market value and shall not include transfers as part of Owner's members estate planning or transfers which occur in the event of the death of a member of Owner or transfers to a member of Owner or to another entity of which a member of Owner possesses at least a fifty-one percent (51%) ownership interest.

#### 2. <u>County's Duties for marketing.</u>

a. Marketing the Property for industrial development will be the joint responsibility of the County and Owner. In its endeavors, the County shall integrate the marketing of the Property, including that portion which will remain zoned for Agricultural Use, into its overall economic development program. Marketing efforts shall include, but not be limited to, proposing the Property as an available site to inquiries by state and regional economic development agencies, placing information about the site on the Internet, either directly or in coordination with other local, regional, or nationwide economic development agencies, and physically showing the site to prospective purchasers. The County may also assist the Owner in the negotiation of a sales price and negotiation of any conditions necessary to affect a sale. The County shall coordinate its marketing efforts with Owner and provide Owner with

Authority, upon receipt of the grant funds, or any portion thereof, from the County shall immediately disburse such amounts to the Owner. The disbursement of the granted funds to the Owner by the Authority shall not be subject to any appropriation or other similar process of the Authority and the granted funds shall be disbursed to the Owner without further necessary action by the Authority. The Authority shall not be under any obligation to convey such funds to the Owner unless granted such funds by the County for such purpose.

- 5. Entire Agreement. This Agreement (including all Exhibits hereto) contains the full and final agreement between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof. No change or modification of this Agreement shall be valid unless the same is in writing and is signed by the parties hereto. No waiver of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be valid unless the same is in writing and signed by the party against which it is sought to be enforced.
- 6. Notices. All notices, demands or other communications that may be necessary or proper under this Agreement shall be deemed duly given if personally delivered upon delivery (or at such time as delivery is not accepted by the intended recipient), or when deposited with Federal Express or other reputable overnight delivery service or when deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, first-class, registered or certified, return receipt requested, addressed respectively as follows:





# PETITION FOR ISSUANCE OF A WRIT OF ELECTION FOR REMOVAL OF THE AUGUSTA COUNTY COURTHOUSE

Comes now your petitioner, the Augusta County Board of Supervisors, pursuant to §15.2-1652 of the Code of Virginia, by counsel, who, for this Petition, states as follows:

- 1. On May 11, 2016, the Board of Supervisors adopted a resolution to petition this Court to issue a Writ of Election on the issue of removal of the Augusta Circuit Court to the Augusta County Government Center complex in Verona, Virginia. A copy of the resolution is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.
- 2. The current Augusta County Circuit Courthouse, constructed in 1901 is located at the corner of East Johnson and South Augusta Streets, in the City of Staunton, Virginia.
- 3. The building that houses the Circuit Courthouse is antiquated and not adequate to meet the needs of the people of Augusta County for proper administration of justice.
  - A. The latest Circuit Courthouse was constructed in 1901, with an addition constructed in 1939. Minor renovations have taken place with the last in 2014. Very limited space exists to expand and will not meet the long term needs of the citizens of Augusta County.
  - B. The Courthouse windows are single pain and need to be replaced with security windows with bullet resistant glass.
  - C. The stairs of the portico entrance are degrading.
  - D. Mortar joints in some areas of the exterior walls are eroding.
  - E. The cornices are degrading and missing elements.
  - F. The masonry on the chimneys has seriously deteriorated.
  - G. The roof is deteriorating and evident by ceiling staining.
  - H. The gutters are in poor condition.
  - I. Lacks adequate toilet facilities.

- L. There is inadequate records retention to accommodate the courts and associated functions.
- 5. With repair and upgrades, neither Court building will meet current standards for courthouse security and accessibility required by current state guidelines. The Court buildings will have to continue operations with exceptions to the security and accessibility standards.
- 6. Per documentation from Frazier Associates (October 2012 Study), attached, and escalating to a 2018 cost, renovating the Circuit Courthouse (only), is eleven million, twenty-two thousand dollars (\$11,022,000.00) and does not bring the court facility to current standards for courthouse security and accessibility required by current state guidelines. The court buildings will have to continue operations with exceptions to the security and accessibility standards. Also, expanding and renovating does not provide a court facility to meet the needs of Augusta County for the next twenty, plus years. A copy of the documentation is attached hereto as Exhibit 2.
- 7. Per documentation by Moseley Architects (May 2016), attached, the estimated cost to build a new Courthouse that houses Circuit Court, General District Court and Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court in the City of Staunton, has been estimated to be approximately fifty-nine million, four hundred dollars (\$59,429,000.00) which does not include undetermined costs and may include multiple buildings. A copy of the documentation is attached hereto as Exhibit 3.
- 8. Per documentation by Moseley Architects (May 2016), attached, the estimated cost to build a new Courthouse that houses Circuit Court, General District Court and Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court for the next twenty years, plus on property already owned by the County in Verona, is forty-five million dollars (\$45,000,000.00). Able space has been provided through Master Planning to provide future expansion of the Courthouse. A copy of the documentation is attached hereto as Exhibit 4.
- 9. A new Courthouse complex in Verona will meet all of the current standards for staff areas, safety, security, and accessibility.
- 10. A new Courthouse complex in Verona will meet today's energy efficiency and fire protection standards.
- 11. A new Courthouse complex in Verona will provide close proximity to the regional jail and detention center.

WHEREAS, the current Augusta County Courthouse, constructed in 1901 and added onto in 1939 and located at the corner of East Johnson and South Augusta Streets in the City of Staunton, is deemed antiquated and inadequate to meet the needs of the people of Augusta County; and

WHEREAS, the Courthouse was characterized as being antiquated and inadequate in a study performed by Frazier Associates in October, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the study performed by Frazier Associates determined that the mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems in the Courthouse are antiquated and inadequate; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for additional bathrooms, improved security, and improved handicapped accessibility; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Augusta County financed a study that demonstrates the extreme difficulty of repairing and upgrading the existing Courthouse to current state standards; and

WHEREAS, an additional study performed by Moseley Architects indicates that any improvements to the existing Courthouse would only meet the needs of County citizens for a short amount of time; and



RE: AccuTEC Blades Performance Agreement

As announced on February 26, 2016, AccuTEC Blades committed to expand its operation in Augusta County. With this expansion, AccuTEC will invest \$5,376,000 and create 53 new jobs over the next 36 months. The average salary for each new worker is expected to be \$47,281.

As you will recall, part of the incentive package that secured this expansion included a \$125,000 grant from the Commonwealth Opportunity Fund (COF). The Board of Supervisors agreed to match this incentive with an additional \$125,000, as required by the grant.

To facilitate the incentive package, staff has prepared the attached performance agreement among the County, the Economic Development Authority, and AccuTEC Blades for your review and consideration.

The Economic Development Authority will consider these same documents at its regular meeting on May 19, 2016.

If the Board is inclined to proceed with consideration of this performance agreement at the regular meeting on May 11, 2016, a suggested motion is provided below:

I move to authorize the Chair of the Augusta County Board of Supervisors to execute and deliver a Performance Agreement among the County of Augusta, the Economic Development Authority of the County of Augusta, and AccuTEC Blades.

Any COF Grant proceeds not disbursed to the Authority by the Performance Date will be promptly returned by the Locality to VEDP for redeposit to the Commonwealth's Development Opportunity Fund.

#### Section 4. <u>Break-Even Point; State and Local Incentives</u>.

(a) State-Level Incentives: VEDP has estimated that the Commonwealth will reach its "break-even point" by the Performance Date. The break-even point compares new revenues realized as a result of the Capital Investment and New Jobs at the Facility with the Commonwealth's expenditures on incentives, including but not limited to the COF Grant. With regard to the Facility, the Locality expects the Commonwealth to provide incentives in the following amounts:

Category of Incentive:	Total Amount
COF Grant Virginia Jobs Investment Program ("VJIP") (Estimated, based on \$1,000 per job)	\$125,000 53,000

The proceeds of the COF Grant shall be disbursed and used for the purposes described in Section 3. The VJIP proceeds shall be disbursed and used by the Company to pay or reimburse itself for recruitment and training costs.

(b) Locality-Level Incentives. The Locality agrees, subject to appropriation, as described below, to provide the following incentives, as matching grants or otherwise, for the Facility, in the form of a 100% return of the increased machinery and tools taxes paid by the Company and a \$1,000 per New Job Job Training Grant, in accordance with (c):

Machinery and Tools Tax Grant ("M & T Grant")  Job Training Grant (Estimated, based on \$1,000 per job)	125,000 53,000

(c) Disbursement of M & T Grant and Job Training Grant: At such time as the aforementioned Capital Investments are incrementally made by the Company and the value of machinery and tools at the Facility is increased by the Locality's Commissioner of Revenue, based on the value of the applicable Capital Investments, one hundred percent (100%) of the tax increment derived by the Locality from such machinery and tools tax between January 1, 2015 and June 1, 2019, shall be appropriated and paid to the Authority for prompt transmittal to the Company whether the machinery and tools or any portion thereof is owned or developed by the Company or a third party. The appropriation will increase with the increased assessed value of the Company's machinery and tools until the total amount of the M&T Grant is cumulatively paid in full. The Board of Supervisors of the Locality hereby directs the Locality's County Administrator to submit for each subsequent fiscal year, as part of the annual budget process, a request to the Board of



#### Section 8. Miscellaneous.

(a) Entire Agreement; Amendments: This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement among the parties hereto as to the incentives described herein and may not be amended or modified, except in writing, signed by each of the parties hereto and by VEDP. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns. The Company may not assign its rights and obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the Locality, the Authority and VEDP.

- (b) Governing Law; Venue: This Agreement is made, and is intended to be performed, in the Commonwealth and shall be construed and enforced by the laws of the Commonwealth. Jurisdiction and venue for any litigation arising out of or involving this Agreement shall lie in the Circuit Court of Augusta County, Virginia and such litigation shall be brought only in such court.
- (c) Counterparts: This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be an original, and all of which together shall be one and the same instrument.
- (d) Severability: If any provision of this Agreement is determined to be unenforceable, invalid or illegal, then the enforceability, validity and legality of the remaining provisions will not in any way be affected or impaired, and such provision will be deemed to be restated to reflect the original intentions of the parties as nearly as possible in accordance with applicable law.
  - (e) Attorney's Fees: Attorney's fees shall be paid by the party incurring such fees.






